ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Most evidence of horse stalls and or milk cow stanchions has been removed. Steel roofing has been installed over cedar shingles on the roof. Two lean-to's have been added much later. Lean-to's are pole barn construction with steel sides and roof. 9' x 7' overhead Door added in the SW corner of the original barn.

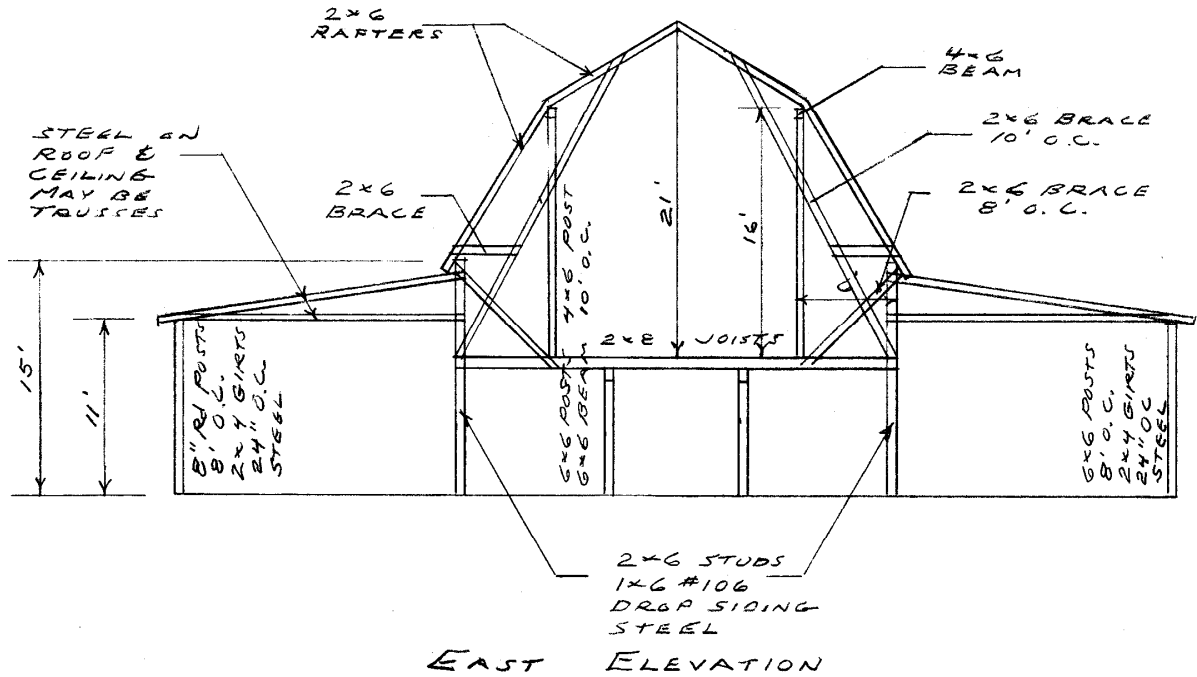
INTERIOR NOTES: Two rows of 6x6 posts, and 6x6 beams to support the 2x8 joists for the hayloft floor. Milk room and tack room with stairs to hayloft are still in the NW corner of original barn. North lean-to Appears to have been built first and has 8" posts 8' O. C. The south lean-to has 6x6 treated posts 8' O. C.

OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls with 1x6 #106 drop siding on all four walls of the original barn. Rafters are 2x6's, with 4x6 posts 10' O. C. and a 4x6 beam to support the hip. A 2x6 brace from the center of the top rafters down to the floor 10' O. C. and a 2x6 brace from the top of the wall in hayloft down to the floor 8' O. C. The ceilings in both lean-to's are lined with steel roofing to keep birds out. It hides rafters or trusses that support the roof.

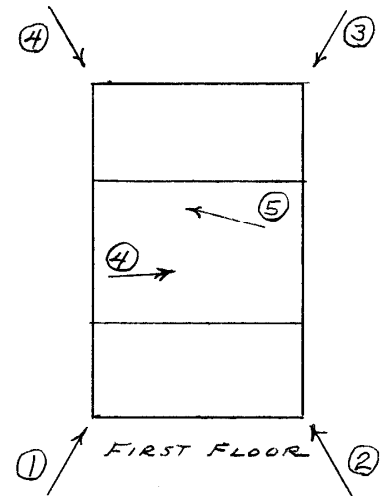
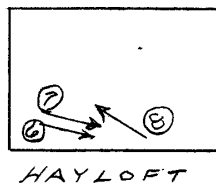

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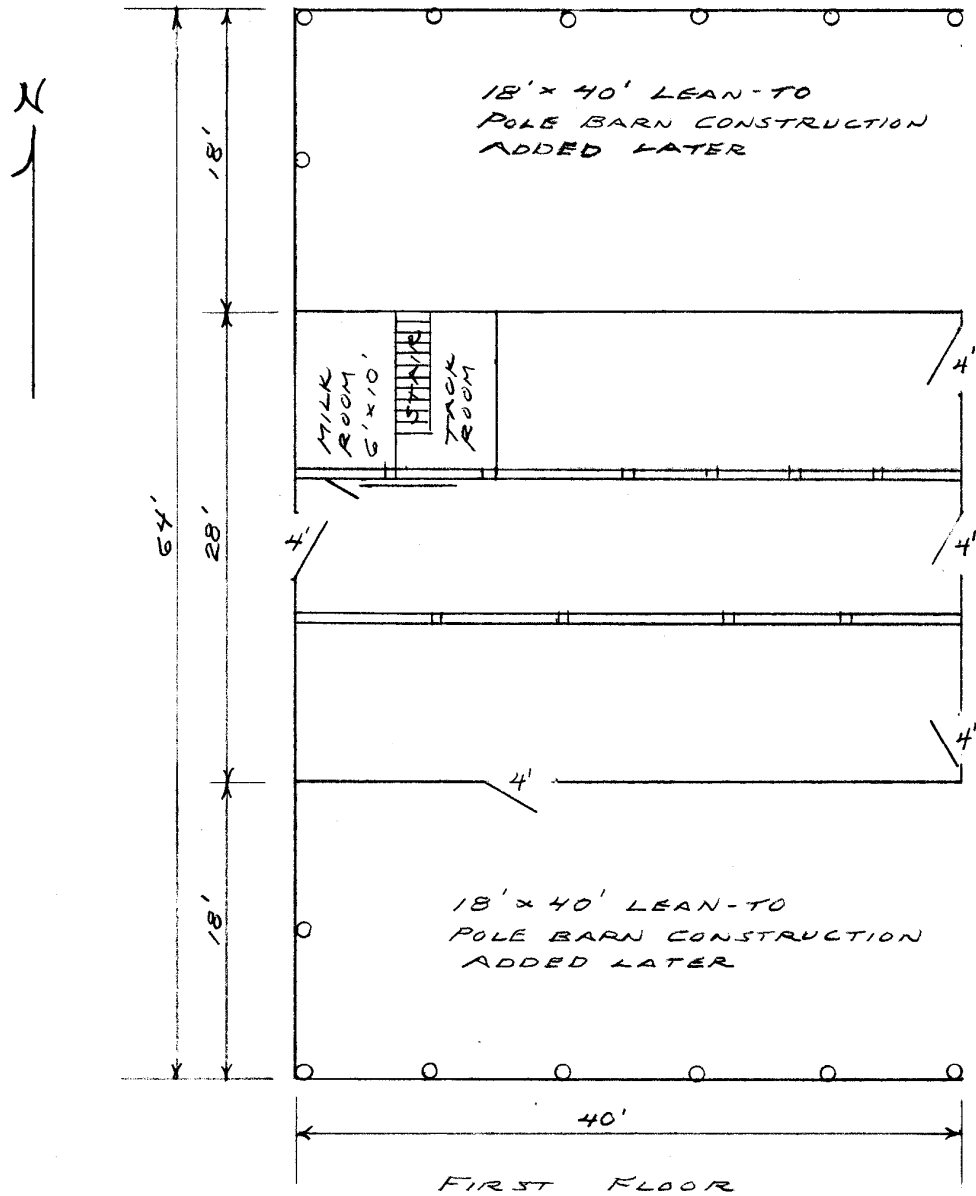

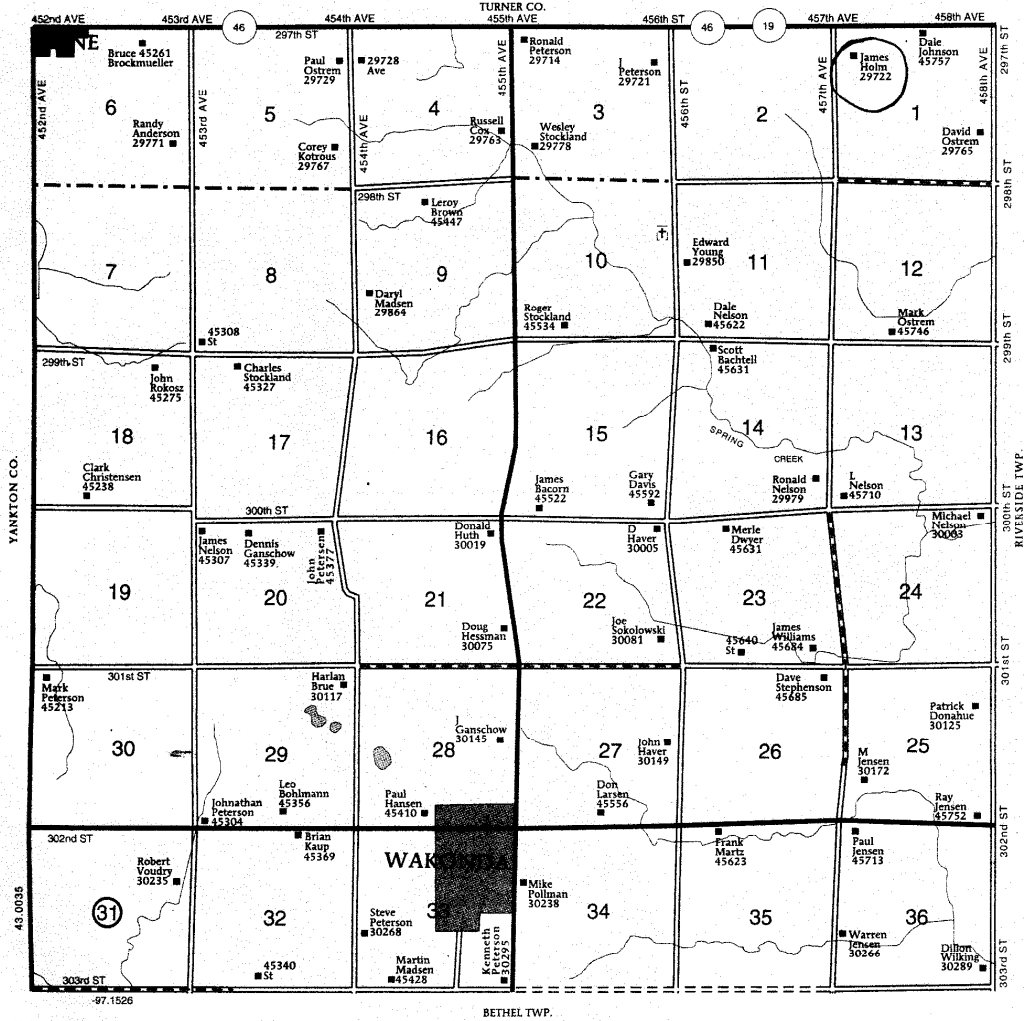
