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






SKETCH MAP





HISTORY

This farm located in the NW ¼ of Section 10, Glenwood Township, Clay County was homesteaded by Louis Gamberg.

The 1894 Clay County Atlas lists Louis Gamberg as the owner.

The 1912, 1924 and 1937 Clay County Atlas lists Alexander Gamberg as the owner.

The 1948 and 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Oliver J. Hult as the owner.

Louis and Augusta Gamberg

Louis, born in 1847, in Halsingland, Sweden, immigrated with his family to the United States in 1868. Augusta Fors, born in 1853, Halsingland, Sweden came with her parents in 1868 to New York and also lived in Lansing Iowa. When Louis and Augusta married, they homesteaded in Section 10, Glenwood Township, Clay County. They lived in a dugout and later built a frame house. They got supplies from Vermillion. Their children were Fred, Mary, Alexander, Willie, Emmanuel and Harry.

Alexander married Edla , a daughter of pioneers the August Soderstroms. Their children were Roy and Violet.

The Alexander Gamberg family lived on the homestead until 1942, then moved to Beresford. Mr. and Mrs. Oliver Hult purchased the farm at that time and made it their home.
