


ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Asphalt shingles applied over cedar shingles.

INTERIOR NOTES: <u>Two rows 3 ply 2x6 beam with 2x6 posts about 3' O.C. Beams are in 8'-2" from the</u> exterior East and West walls leaving a 9'- 8" center alley. 2x8 floor joists for the hayloft floor.


OTHER NOTES: Four foot poured concrete wall with 2x6 wall above. Walls 11' high on the East and West sides. Walls are balloon framed on gable ends. Horizontal sheathing on East and West walls, Diagonal on the gable ends. ½"x6" cedar lap siding on all walls. Original dividers for farrowing pens are still in place. They are removable by sliding them up out of a groove in the concrete wall and double 2x6 stud with cleats. 8"x10" four light over 8"x10" four light window, double hung for ventilation. *PHYSICAL NOTES: Rafters are 5 ply 1x4 gothic round with sheathing, cedar shingles and asphalt shingles. Two very ornate metal cupolas. Barn is in excellent condition










This farm located in the SE ¹/₄ of the SE 1/4, in Section 31, Riverside Township, Clay County and homesteaded by Cornelius Nelson.

The 1894 and 1901 Clay county Atlas lists A. Hallam as the owner.

The 1912 and 1924 Clay County Atlas lists Ben Folvik as the owner. The farm was called "Southwest Riverside Farm".

The 1937 and 1948 Clay County Atlas lists Alma Folvik as the owner. In 1937 A. S. Folvik was listed as the operator (renter).

The 1956 Clay County Atlas lists C. E. Friedland as the owner.

Richard and Vikke Eilts The present owners.

This farm was owned by a Friedland and is known as the Friedland place. Mr. Friedland was a school teacher. Palmer Knutson had him as a teacher when he attended grade school.
