

ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site, some of horse stalls have been removed. Steel roofing													
applied on the roof. Some of the lower walls have steel roofing applied. 19' x 33' open shed attached on													
West side. Kirk Sorensen thinks that the open shed was built at the same time, but roof was changed to													
one slope and covered with st	eel roofing.												
INTERIOR NOTES: (3) rows of 6x6 posts and 6x6 beams of rough sawn cottonwood running East to													
West. Beams are 7'- 6" O.C. with 2x10 rough sawn cottonwood floor joists which makes a very strong													
support for the hayloft floor, (actually is over built). Some of the original horse stalls are still in place,													
and also the milk cow stall.													
OTHER NOTES: First floor windows are four light (9x12) over four light (9x12) barn sash which are													
are moveable as a double hung window for ventilation. Five four light (9x12) barn sash in hayloft. One													
swinging door on North, East and South sides and a sliding door on the East.													
Rafters are modified braced ra	after trusses.												
*PHYSICAL NOTES: Barn is in fair condition. Needs siding, some of the siding is gone and the													
diagonal sheathing is starting	to deteriorate. Interior	studs, rafters, rafter brad	cing, 6x	6 beams and 6x6									
posts are in very good shape.	All of the posts, beam	s, 2x6 framing and diago	nal she	athing are rough									
sawn cottonwood.







HISTORY

This farm located in the SW ¼ of Section 15, Vermillion Township, Clay County was homesteaded by Josette Auge.

The 1894 and 1901 Clay County Atlas lists Lee & Prentis as the owners.

The 1912 Clay County Atlas lists C. E. Prentis as the owner.

The 1924, 1937, 1948 and 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Christ Sorensen as the owner.

The Following Is From

Kurt Sorensen, present owner.

Christ Sorensen born 1880's in Denmark. Died in Clay County 1956.

Christ Sorensen immigrated from Demark to United States in 1913. Changed his name by dropping the T to Chris.

He bought the land in 1915.

Built the cattle shed and hay shed in 1916.

Built the barn in 1917. He and his wife Hannah hosted an open barn/barn dance upon the completion of the barn. Someone dropped a cigarette or cigar and started a fire. It was discovered soon enough to be extinguished and avoid a disaster.

Son was Morton Sorensen, born 1919, died Febr. 1983.

Morton's son Kirk Sorensen now owns the land and lives here.

Soren A. Sorenson, father to Chris Sorensen (Kirks great grand father) immigrated to United States and homesteaded on Section 8, Meckling twp, Clay County.

Calle Nisien Johnsen, homesteaded on Section 32, Meckling twp, Clay County. Built the Danish brick barn there. Clay was obtained on site, bricks made and fired on site. Barn is still standing. He was a brother in law to Soren A. Sorensen. He worked on the transcontinental railroad first and worked part time on the railroad after he homesteaded.
