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



HISTORY

This farm located in the NE ¼ of Section 11 Prairie Center Township, Clay County was homesteaded by John Benson.

The 1894 Clay county Atlas lists John Benson as the owner.

The 1901 Clay County Atlas lists Andrew Benson as the owner.

The 1912, 1924, and 1937 Clay County Atlas lists Christian Borup as the owner.

The 1948 Clay county Atlas lists Christine Borup as the owner.

The 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Thomas Host as the owner.

Construction Notes

The grain bins above the driveway have a floor over the top the length of the corncrib (North to South). This floor has doors that can be opened to fill the four bins from the elevator. Note on the drawing the bevel on this floor on the East and West sides. This made it easier to fill the corncribs on each side with out letting earn corn being spilled into the granaries. It also allowed filling the corncribs to the rafters.

This corn crib would hold 2050 bushels of ear corn on the West side and 2450 bushels of ear corn on the East side for a total of 4500 bushels. The grain bins above the drive would hold 2100 bushels of grain or shelled corn.
