ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Horse stalls and milk cow stalls have removed. Walls are insulated and covered for shop. West 24' have been removed for a folding door for the airplane. The gable end is supported by a four ply 2x12 beam. Feed room in the NW corner has been removed.

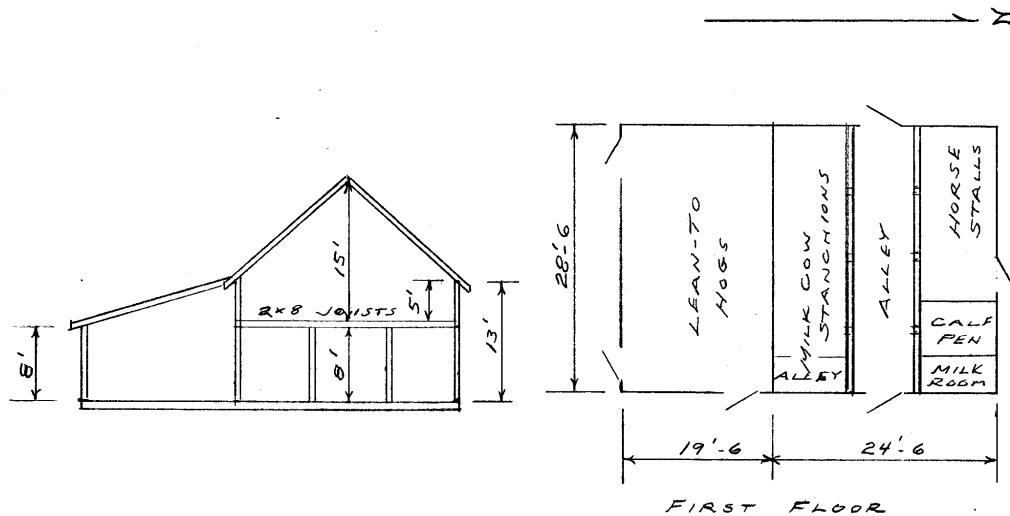
INTERIOR NOTES: 4'x9' milk room in the NE corner and a 9' x 9' calf pen west of milk room. Two rows 6x6 posts and 6x6 beam. 4'x9' alley on the SW corner of main barn with gates at each end. Was used as calf pen also. South 16'-6" x 28'-6" lean-to was for hogs.

OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls 13' high on the North and South sides. The South walls of lean-to is 2x6 stud wall 8' high. 2x6 stud walls on the gable ends. Horizontal sheathing and 1/2"x6" cedar lap siding. 4"x24" four light windows. 2x6 rafters with a 2x4 laminated on one side. 2x6 bracing from top of wall in hayloft down to floor joists.

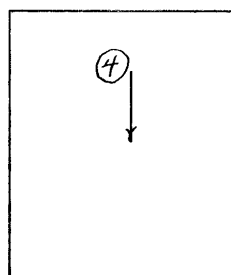
*PHYSICAL NOTES: Barn is in very good condition. Siding is painted. Looks very nice.

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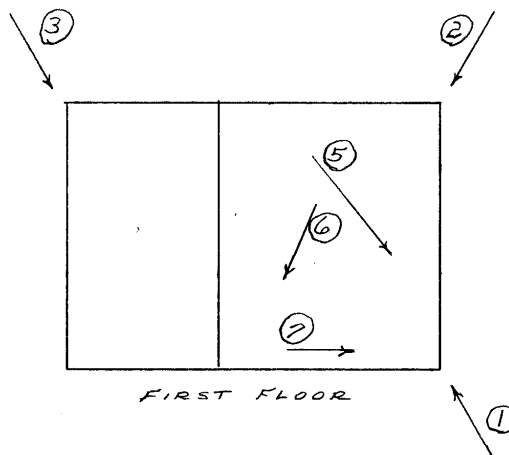
SKETCH MAP

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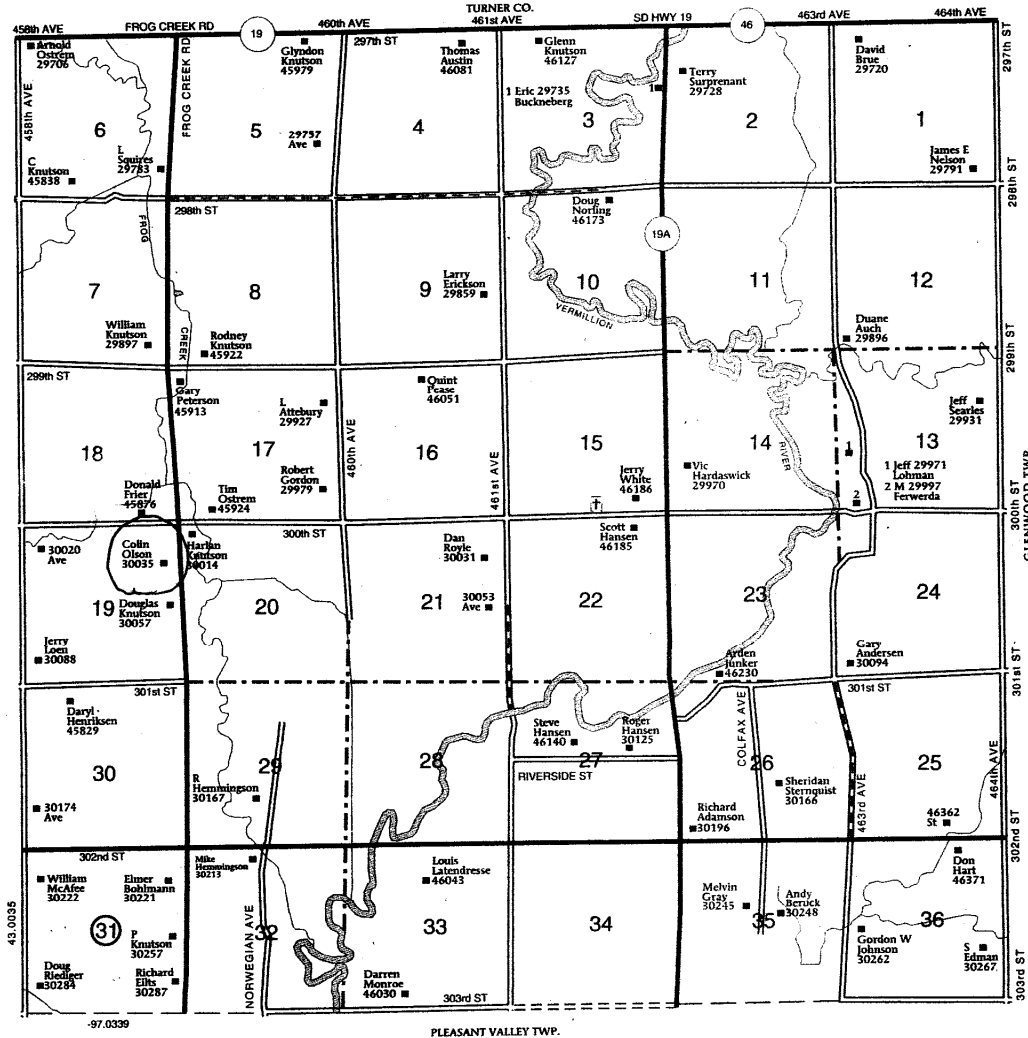
