ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Steel roofing over the cedar shingles. Concrete floor poured over existing concrete floor. Horse stalls and milk cow stanchions have been removed. Sliding doors on the East and West ends have been replaced with two 8'x7' steel overhead doors. 8'x16' milk room has been added on the South side on the SW corner. Deck has been added on the West side which is the same level as the hayloft floor with stairs down to the ground level to the South.

INTERIOR NOTES: <u>Two rows 6x6 posts with 6x6 beams. 2x10 floor joists for hayloft floor. Two</u> 10'x10'x 14'8" high granaries on NW corner. These go through the hayloft floor up into the hayloft.

OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls 14'8" high with horizontal sheathing on all four walls. ½"x6" cedar lap Siding. 9x12 four light windows. One metal cupola on roof. Roof is braced with double 2x6 from the hip down to the floor in 3 equal spaced places on each side in hayloft. 2x6 bracing from top of wall in hayloft out and down to the hayloft floor and to the posts and beams below.







# HISTORY

The Following Is From Liz Merrigan

Grandfather – Edward Merrigan bought this farm (a homestead claim) in 1892 from Anders Anderson who homesteaded here. Edward Merrigan built this barn in 1916. His son John Earl Merrigan helped to build the barn.

John Earl Merrigan aka Earl Merrigan was Elizabeth Merrigan's father.

Earl Merrigan removed the horse stalls about 1954 and added stanchions to enlarge his dairy. They only milked 3 to 4 cows before. He also added the milk room on the SW corner.
