ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Cedar shingles removed when corrugated galvanized steel was installed on roof. Horse stalls and milk stanchions have been removed.

INTERIOR NOTES: Post and beam construction. 8x8 posts with 6x8 beams about 12' O. C. in the center 22' x 50'. 4x6 angle braces with 6x6 beam at the top for a center support for rafters. All of the posts and beams are mortise and tendon. Round pegs were not used. Large spikes secure all tendons.

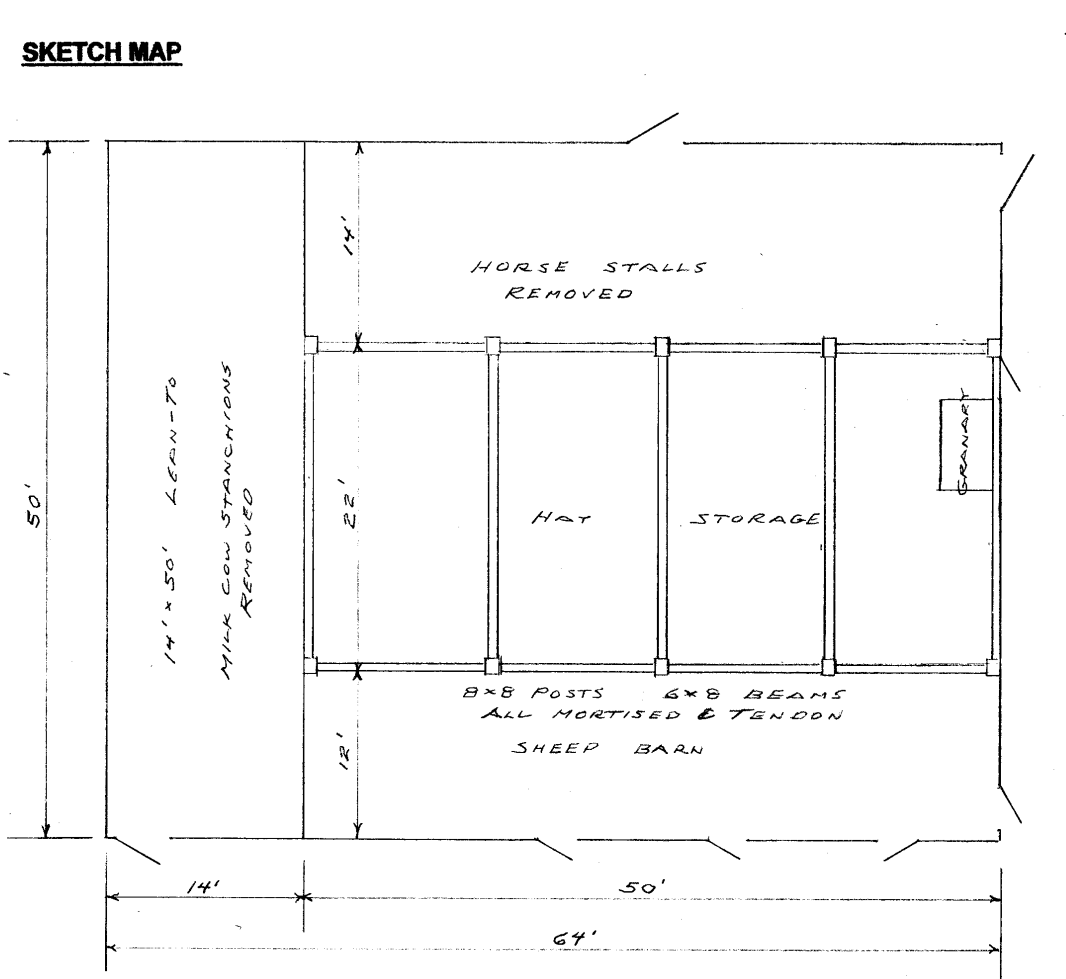
OTHER NOTES: Sills are 6 x 8. Exterior walls were 6x6 posts with 3x4 beams, except the two 8x8 posts in the East gable end. The 1x12 vertical siding had battens to cover the cracks. Hayloft was from the ground level to the peak in this 22'x 50' area. This area would hold about 80 tons of loose hay.

*PHYSICAL NOTES: Barn is in poor condition.

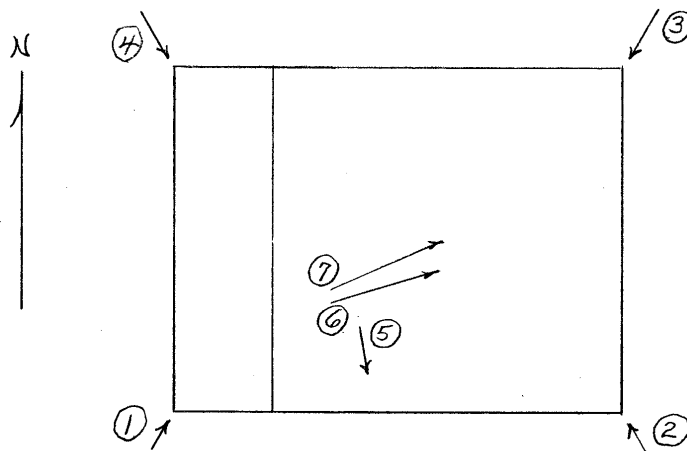
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SKETCH MAP



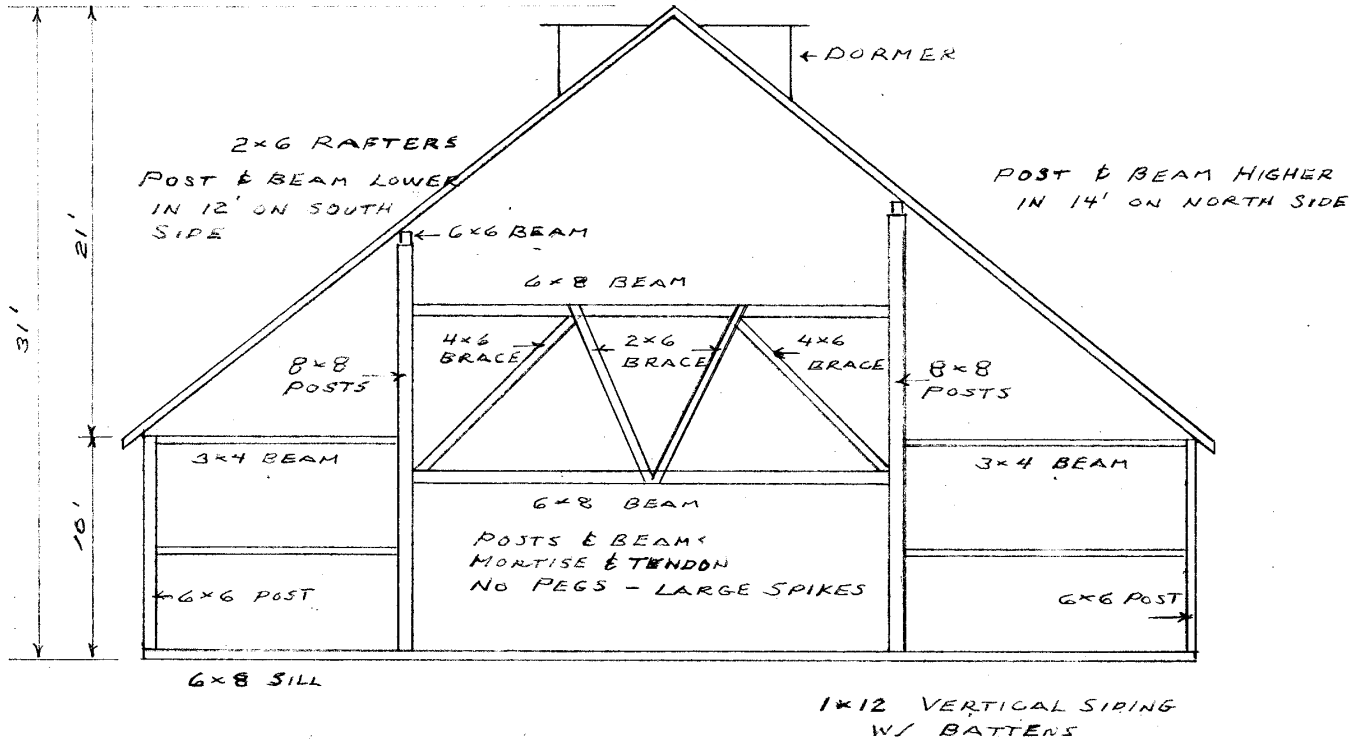

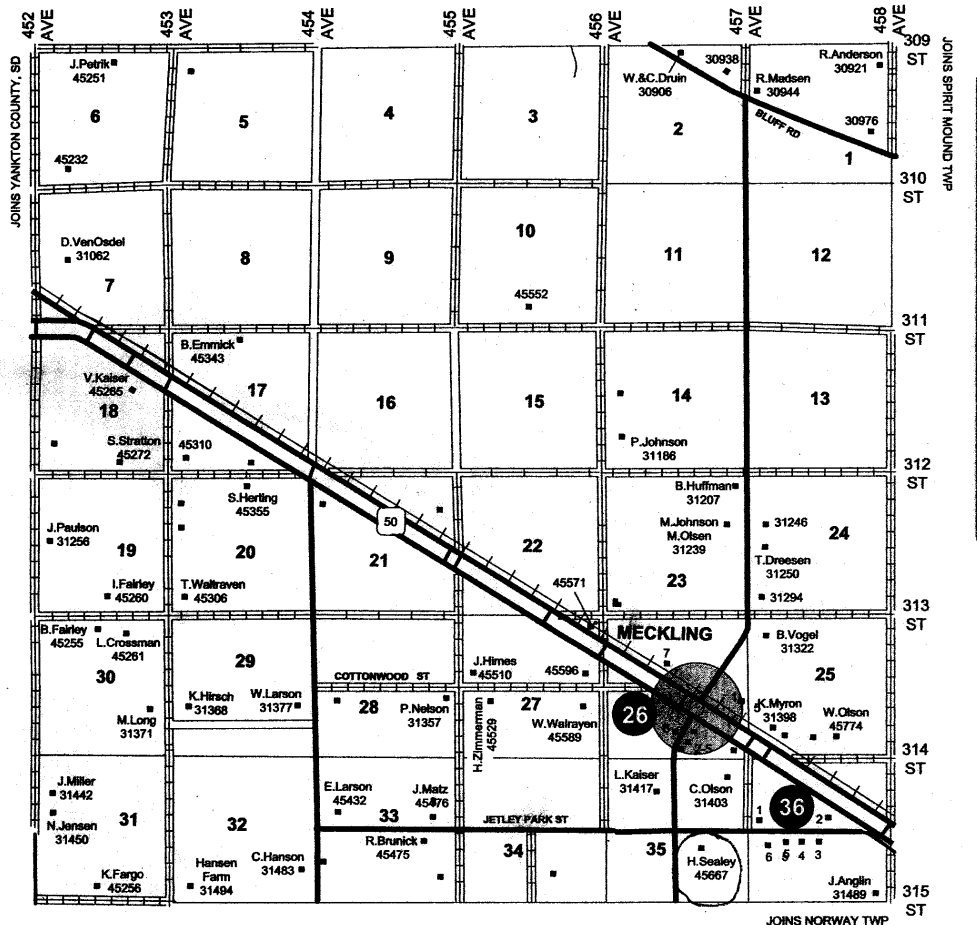
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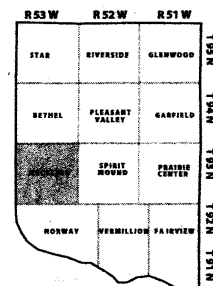

**The Following Information Was Furnished by
Jane Slattery**

Fred Demann purchased the SE ¼ of Section 35, Meckling Township from Albert and Melinda Edgerton on March 19, 1902. Henrietta Sealy who has lived here all of her married life, says that there was a shack for a house in 1902. The current home was built in 1904 or 1905. A man by the name of Herman Peterson or a man named Johnson built this house. The barn was built between 1904 and 1909

Fred and Sophia Demann's daughter Caroline inherited this farm. Caroline's son Harold Sealy inherited the farm from her.

Jane Slattery a great granddaughter of Fred Demann has a picture of the farm, which is prior to 1917. The date is a guess, based on the people and the new Avery tractor.
