ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. All stalls, stanchions and milk room have been removed. Exposed exterior walls and roof have been covered with steel roofing. Hayloft floor raised to 16' except the West 12' which is raised to 13'. Walls and ceiling are insulated and lined with steel roofing. Lean-to's Added on the North and South sides in 1960's. Large overhead installed on the East wall.


INTERIOR NOTES: <u>Had 6x6 posts and 6x6 beams to support hayloft floor.</u> Joists are 2x8. All of the 2x6's for studs, rafters and bracing, 2x8 floor joists, 6x6 posts and 6x6 beams were rough sawn cottonwood.

OTHER NOTES: Shop is heated and air conditioned. Has an automotive hoist.

2x6 rafters with 2x6 bracing for a braced wall and rafter system. 2x6 walls with rough sawn cottonwood diagonal sheathing and $\frac{1}{2}$ "x6" cedar lap siding. Metal cupalo.

*PHYSICAL NOTES: Barn is in very good condition.




