OTHER NOTES: Very good looking heated shop.

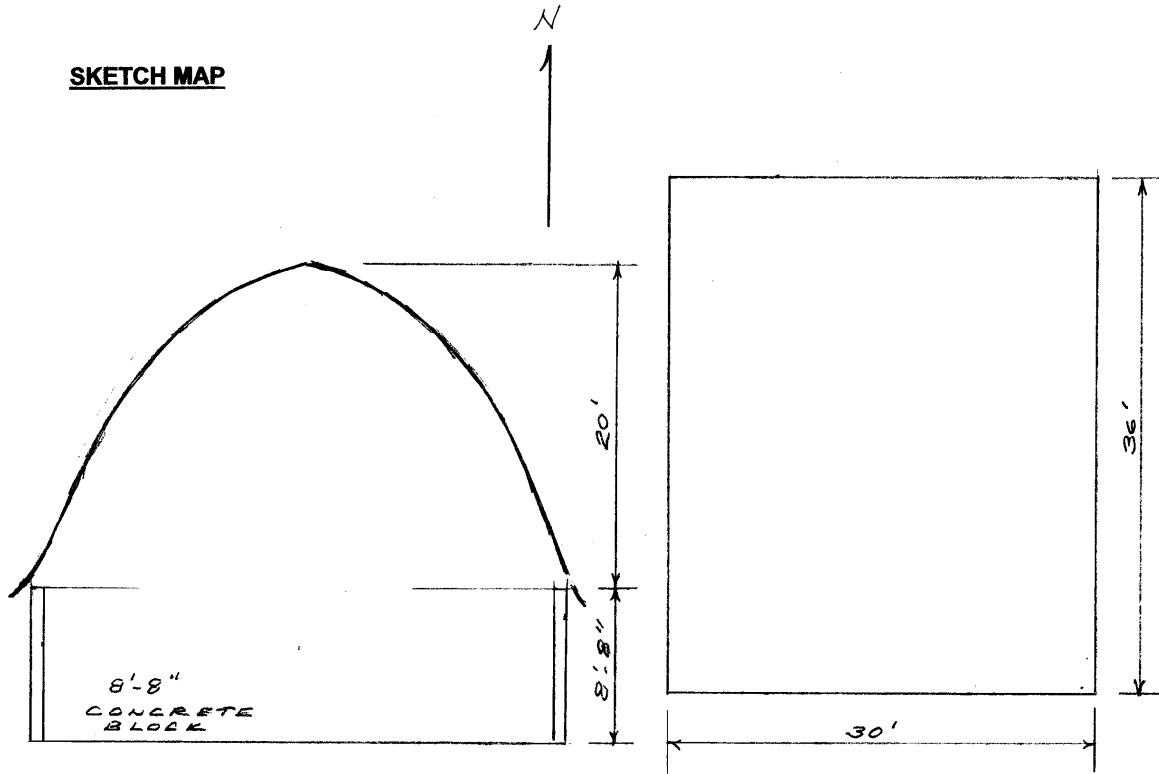

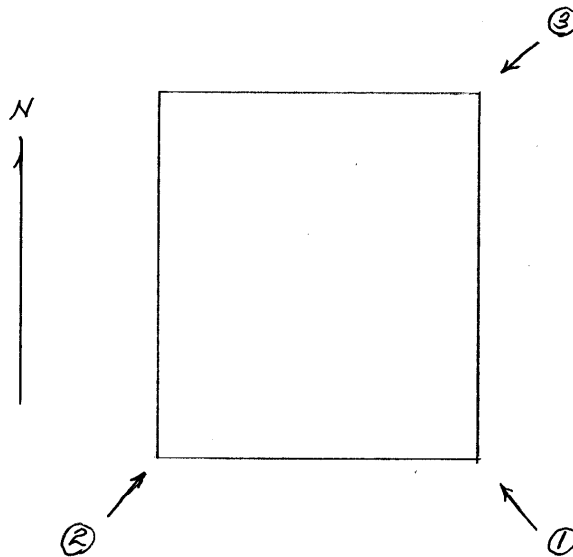

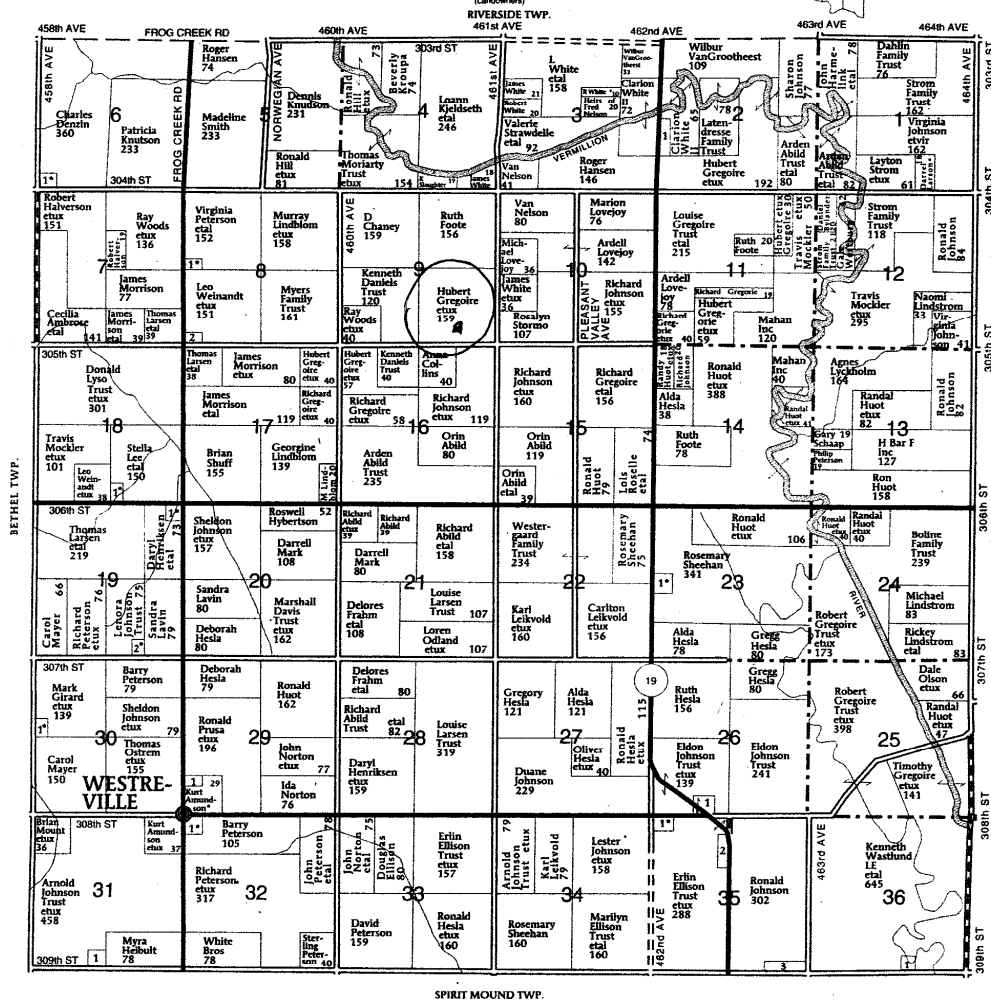
