ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Any evidence of horse stalls and milk cow stanchions has been removed. Granaries appear to have been added later and extended into hayloft. 14' x 32' lean-to on the West side may have been added later.

INTERIOR NOTES: Has two rows of 4x6 posts and a 6x6 for a beam. The floor joists for the hayloft floor are 2x8's. A 2x6 solid wall divides the South 16' from the North 16'. Two 9' x 8' granaries have been added on the East side and on the West side in the North part of the barn. These extend into the hayloft.

OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls with 1x6 #106 drop siding and 2x4 stud walls in the lean-to with 1x6 #106 drop siding. The rafters are 2x6's, with two rows of 4x4 posts 8' O. C. and a 2x6 beam supporting the center of the rafters. 2x6 ceiling joists in lean-to for bracing. Window are 8"x10" four light.

Three lighting rods are still on the ridge of the roof.

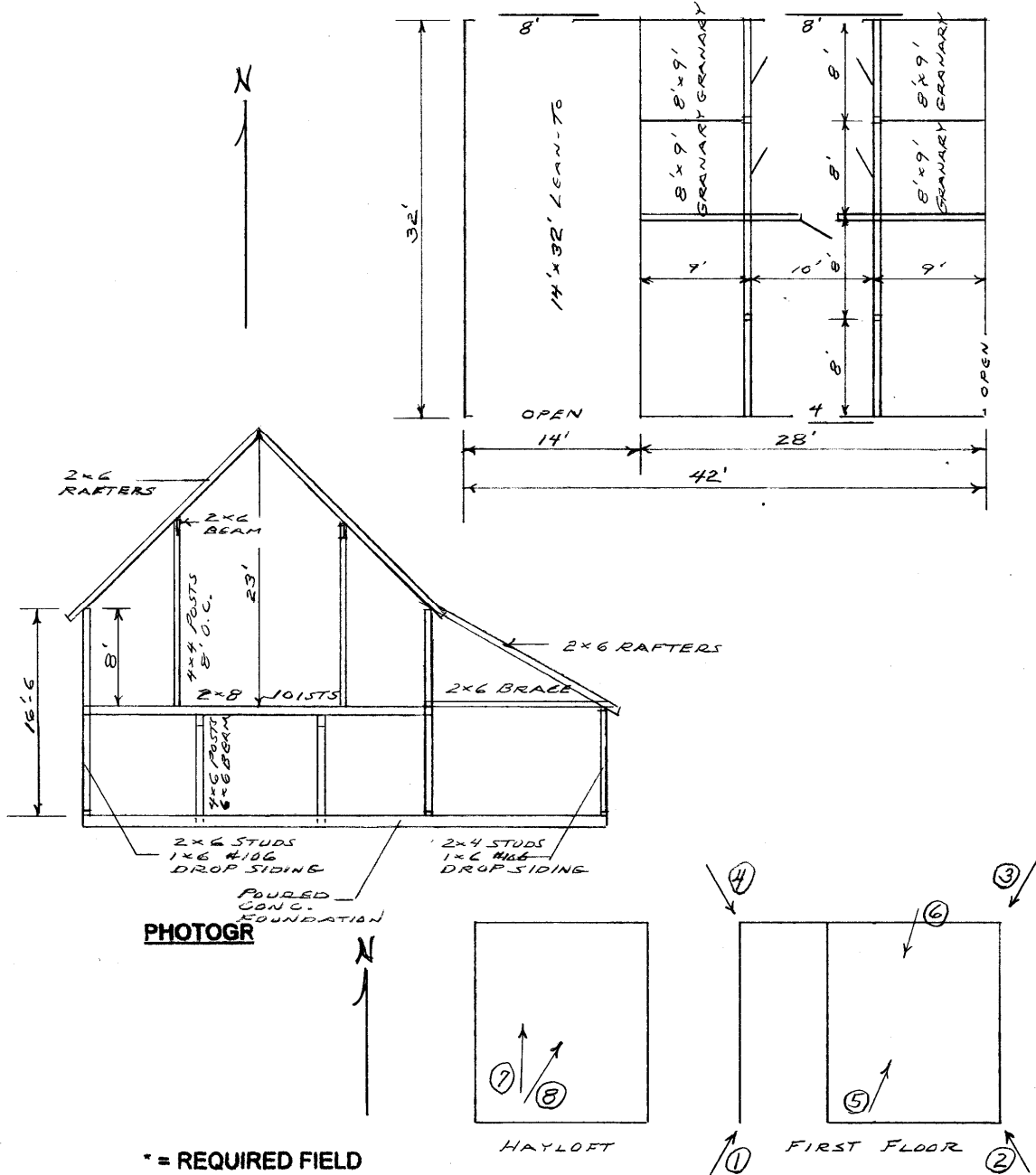

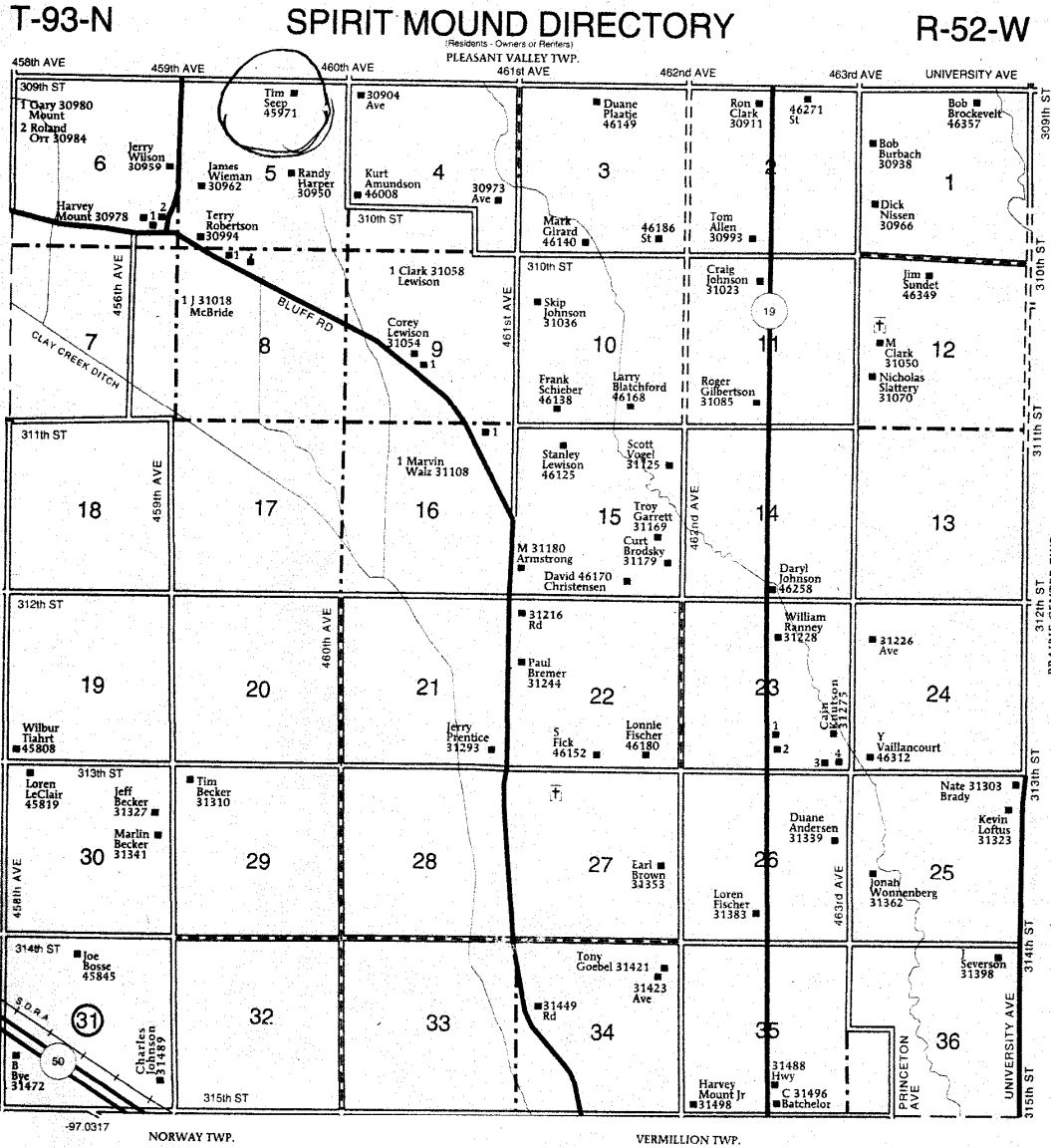

The 1894 and 1901 Clay County Atlas lists Jacob Johnson as the owner. (The NE ¼ of the NE1/4 of Sec 5 was homesteaded by Osmond Mortvedt and owned by B. J. Mortvedt in 1894).

1912, 1924 and 1937 Clay County Atlas lists J. P. Knudson as the owner.

1948 Clay county Atlas lists Hazel Emme as the owner.

1956 Clay County Atlas lists Carel Emme as the owner.
