ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Any evidence of milk cow stanchions or horse stalls has been removed. Walls have been covered with galvanized corrugated steel roofing. Eight 8'x8' pens have been installed on the North and South walls. Pens might have been for lambing. They appear to be too light of construction for swine farrowing.


INTERIOR NOTES: <u>Has two rows of 6x6 posts with 6x6 for beam. Floor joists are 2x8's. Has 4x6 posts</u> under two 4x6 cross beams in the hayloft. 4x6 posts are on top of this beam to support the 6x6 beams that support the 2x6 rafters.


OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls with 1x6 #106 drop siding. Siding has been covered with galvanized corrugated steel roofing long ago. Windows are 12"x28" two light, may have been replaced at some time, as they appear to be house windows with metal sash bolts.

*PHYSICAL NOTES: <u>Barn is in good condition. Needs some repairs on some doors and windows.</u> Roof will need re-roofing soon. Some of the steel siding is loose.
