







HISTORY

This farm located in The NW ¼ of Section 3, Glenwood Township, was homesteaded by John G, Althouse.

The 1894 Clay County atlas lists John G. Althouse as the owner.

The 1901 Clay County Atlas lists John Bergquist as the owner

The 1912 Clay County Atlas lists the owner as the John Bergquist estate.

The 1924 Clay County Atlas lists Arthur Norling as the owner.

The 1937 Clay Count Atlas lists Mable Norling as the owner.

The 1948 and 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Art Norling as the owner.

History of John Berquist family

The history of the "Norling Farm" dates back to John G. and Christina (Bergquist) Althouse, who homesteaded this farm. On November 6, 1900 Christina's brother John Berquist rented the farm from the Althouse's until the terms of the sale could be worked out. John Berquist purchased the land for \$7,000 and is listed as the owner in the 1901 Clay County Atlas. The barn was built at this time.

John Bergquist died suddenly. His wife and their three young children, Mabel, Amy and Fred, moved to Omaha to live with John and Christina Althouse. John Bergquist's brother, Louis and a neighbor boy Arthur Norling, farmed the land. When Mabel Bergquist, married Arthur Norling, they rented the land and began buying the farm from Mabel's sister and brother, Amy and Fred Bergquist. Mabel (Bergquist) Norling died tragically leaving behind five young children, Norma, Milo, Joy, Donna and Betty. Following Mabel's death, Arthur Norling married Mabel's sister, Amy. Four children, John, Arthur, Charles and Richard were born to this union. Richard Norling became the owner of the farm following his mother's death in 1980.
