





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HISTORY

This farm located in the NW ¼ of section 4, Garfield Township, Clay County was homesteaded by Andrew Dahlin. He is believed to have immigrated from Sweden.

The 1894 and 1901 Clay County Atlas lists Andrew E. Dahlin as the owner.

The 1912 Clay County Atlas lists Erick Dahlin as the owner.

The 1924 Clay County Atlas lists John Dahlin as the owner. It is very likely that John Dahlin or Erick Dahlin built or had this barn built.

The 1937 Clay County Atlas lists Orvie Sampson as the owner

The 1948 and 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Emma Sampson as the owner.
