ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. 14' x 32' lean-to added on the East side. Foundation is native stone. It has been repaired with poured concrete in places. I can not see any mortar in the original foundation. Steel roofing has been applied on the roof over cedar shingles.

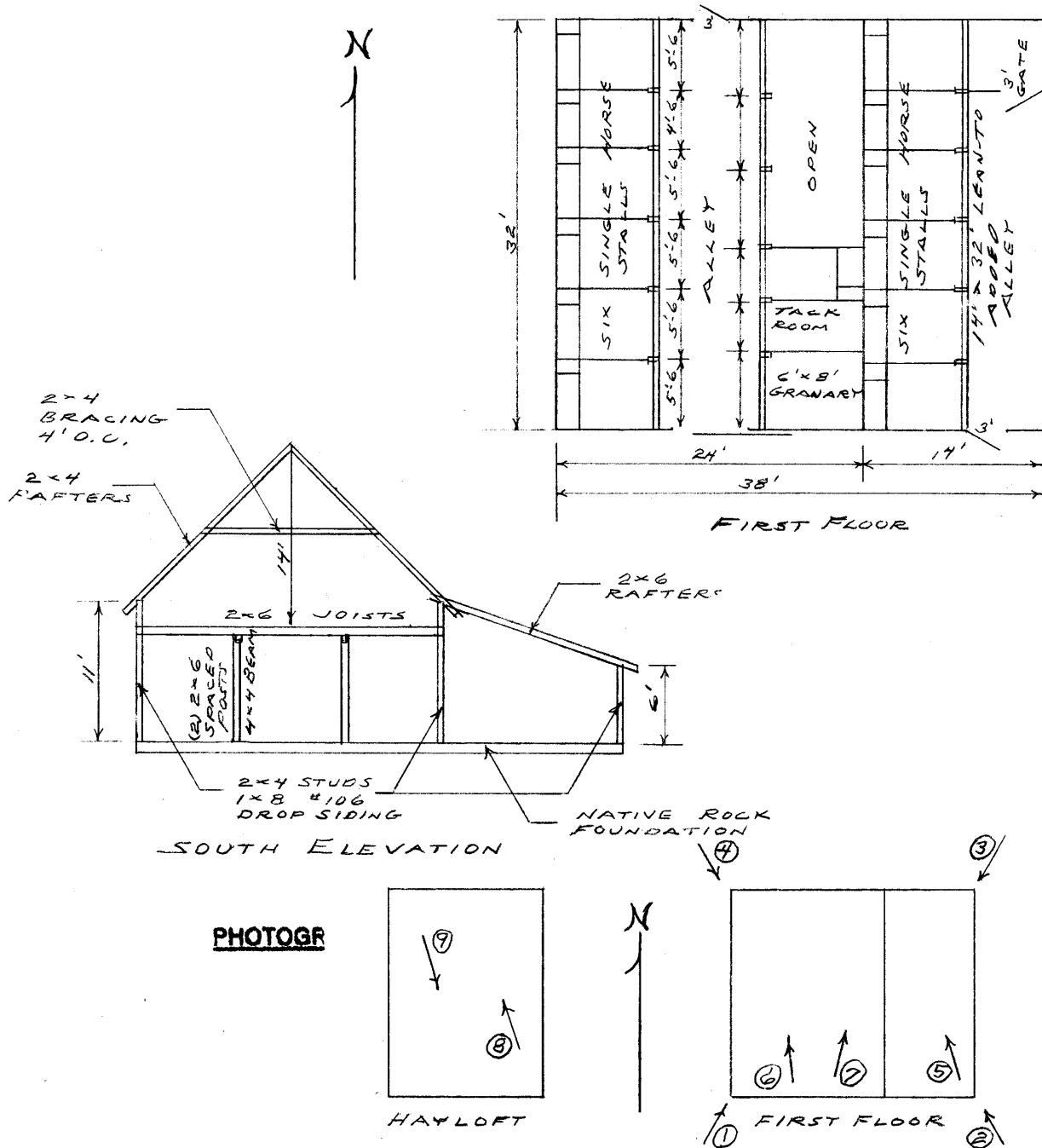
INTERIOR NOTES: Two rows of spaced double 2x6 posts, 4x4 beams and 2x6 floor joists for the hayloft floor. 6' x 8' granary and a 4' x 8' tack room are still in the SE corner. Most of the single horse stalls are still in place in the original barn and in the East lean-to.

OTHER NOTES: 2X4 stud walls with 1x8 #106 drop siding on all four exterior walls and the East wall of the original barn. The 8" drop siding on the East wall of the original barn is almost new. Windows are 10" x 12" four light. Rafters are 2x4's with 2x4 horizontal bracing 4' O. C. The 2x4 studs, 2x4 rafters, 2x4 bracing, 2x6 floor joists. 2x6 posts and 4x4 beams are all rough sawn cottonwood.

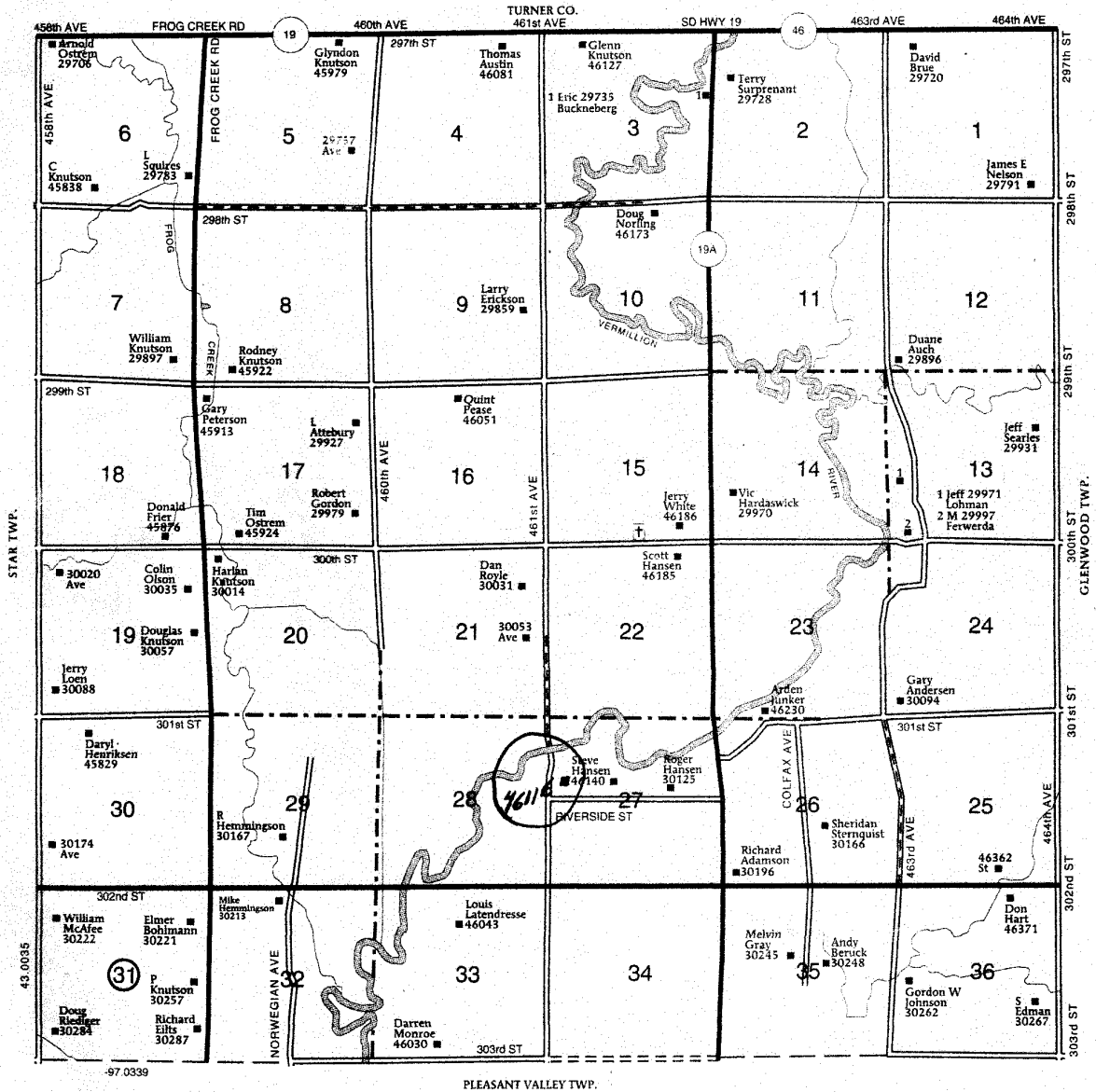

## **HISTORY**

This farm located in the W ½, NW ¼ of Section 27, Riverside Township, Clay County was homesteaded by John E. Shoberg or John E. Sjoberg.

The 1894, 1901 and 1912 Clay County Atlas lists Louisa Anderson (Mrs. J. G. Anderson) as the owner.

The 1924, 1937, 1948 and 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Oscar R. Holmquist as the owner.

Lovisa (Lousia) Regina (Shoberg) Anderson was the daughter of John E. Shoberg or (Sjoberg). Names were changed to be more Americanized. Lousia Anderson married John G. Anderson who was born Nov. 12, 1841 and died July 11, 1928. They lived on the original John E. Shoberg homestead and raised 10 children there. Lousia (Shoberg) Anderson must have inherited the farm from her parents, as it was listed with her as the owner in the 1894, 1901 and 1912 Clay County Atlas. Their children were; J. Alfred Anderson, Gustaf A. Anderson, born Sept 20, 1872, Emma Otelie Anderson, born Mar. 1, 1874, Alma E. Anderson, born in 1879, Anna Margreta Anderson, born Sept. 19, 1881, Herman T. Anderson, born July 14, 1885, Lallie R. Anderson, born July 28, 1886, married Oscar Holmquist, and they became the owners of this farm, Mamie T. Anderson, was born Nov. 7, 1887. This is only eight children, two may have died at birth.

John Gustaf Anderson was known as (John G. Anderson) and was the oldest brother. His brothers were; Fritz, August, Anders Gustaf Anderson (the fifth brother), born Sept. 1853, Alfred Anderson, born about 1854. Sisters were; Brita Anderson, born about 1850 and Anna Anderson, born in 1852.
