



ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Any evidence of horse stalls or milk cow stanchions						
has been removed. Roof covered with 1-1/4"x26" galvanized corrugated steel roofing over cedar shingles.						
The West lean-to was added later and has a poured foundation. The North lean-to was added after the West						
lean-to. Walls have been covered with embossed brick steel siding.						
INTERIOR NOTES: Two rows of 4x6 posts with 4x6 beams support 2x8 joists for hayloft floor. Area						
divided into pens. May have been used for calving. West wall of original barn still has the 1x8 #106 drop						
siding with red paint. North lean-to has 6" posts 8" O. C. with girts and 1x12 vertical siding with battens,						
OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls, 1x8 #106 drop siding and embossed brick steel siding on three exterior						
walls. Rafters are 2x6's. Windows are 8" x10"four light and one window in the South wall of the West						
lean-to has a 6"x28" three light. All of the 2x6's and 2x8's and 4x6's are rough sawn cottonwood.						
Barn has a wooden cupola.


SKETCH MAP









HISTORY

This farm located in the NE ¼ of Section 22, Bethel Township, Clay County was homesteaded by Charles Nelson.

The 1894 Clay County Atlas lists Charles Nelson as the owner.

The 1901, 1912 and 1924 Clay County Atlas lists Nels C. & Hans M. Nelson as the owners. The farm was named "Morningside Farm" in the 1924 atlas.

The 1937 Clay County Atlas lists Carrie M. Nelson as the owner.

The 1948 and 1956 Clay County Atlas lists W. H. Beaty as the owner.

The following Is From The

Wakonda, S. D. Centennial Book 1885 – 1985

Hans M. and Mable Nelson Family

Hans M. Nelson (March 27, 1875 – April 3, 1963 was born in Clay county to Hans and Hannah Nelson who homesteaded four south, one east of and ½ mile south of Wakonda. Their sons, Hans married Mable Conrad (Feb. 11, 1885- May 17, 1940) and they continued to live on the farm and raised four children. Maynard Nelson (June 15, 1914). Pearl Nelson Sorenson (Aug. 26, 1915), Harlan Nelson (May 29, 1921) and Dorthy Nelson Babb (Jan. 11, 1927). Hans built onto the homestead house and then built a larger house in 1930 which was home to many people. As friends and relatives came from the "old country," Denmark, many of them lived with Hans and Mable until they could get started on their own. It was not unusual to have extra people to feed and Pearl remembers well stirring up a cake when they could see unexpected company coming down the long driveway.

Wayne Beaty, a great grandnephew of the homestead family, now owns on this farm with his wife.
