ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: <u>Moved about 300' North and remodeled. Appears to have been built with</u> some urgency. Studs were spliced at the top to make the wall 2' taller. Some of the studs and the added top on all studs are rough sawn cottonwood and some are regular 2x6. All milk cow stanchions and horse stalls have been removed.

INTERIOR NOTES: <u>Has two rows 4x6 posts and 4x6 beam to support hayloft floor</u>. Floor joists are 2x8's, some rough sawn cottonwood and some milled.

OTHER NOTES: <u>Windows were 8"x10" four light.</u> Walls are 2x6, no sheathing and ½"x6" cedar lap siding. Rafters are 2-1/2" to 3" wide x 6" rough sawn cottonwood 3'- 4" O.C. Two 2x4's rough sawn for a top plate. Very wide sheathing on roof. One metal cupola.

*PHYSICAL NOTES:	Barn is in poor condition. Without sheathing the ½"x6" cedar siding bows and
allows the rain to star	t rotting the siding. The siding is in very poor condition.



# HISTORY

The Following Information Was Furnished Ronald Larson

Peter Larson homesteaded on this farm in 1876. He would have built the first barn South of where it is today. He moved it about 300' North up on top of the hill. There appears to have been some urgency to get the barn moved and remodeled.

Peter Larson's son Robert Larson built the second barn in 1920 for a draft horse barn.

Robert Larson's son Wesley Larson farmed the land.

Wesley Larson's son Ronald Larson now owns and farms the land.

Ronald Larson's son lives on the farm and helps his father farm.

This is the fifth generation of Larson's to live on here and farm the land for the last 136 years.
