ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Roof covered with steel roofing over cedar shingles. All evidence of horse stalls and milk cow stanchions has been removed. Windows have been replaced with one piece of Plexiglas. East lean-to may have been added later, as it has 1x6 #106 drop siding under the ½" x 6" cedar lap siding.

INTERIOR NOTES: Two rows of 4x6 posts with a 4x6 beam supporting 2x8 floor joists for hayloft floor.


2x8 ceiling joists 8' O. C. in East lean-to. 1x10 rafter bracing 8' O. C. in East lean-to. 2x4 braces from
center of rafters down to exterior wall at floor level, 4' O. C. and a 2x8 from the bottom of rafters down to
the floor, 4' O. C.

OTHER NOTES: 2x4 stud walls with 1x10 shiplap and ½"x6" cedar lap siding on all four walls, except

the East wall of the lean-to which has 1x6 #106 drop siding under the cedar siding. No cupola on the roof. windows were 9"x 12" four light. Rafters in the east lean-to are 2x6's and rafters in the main barn are

2x4's.





#### Hay Country History

#### A story of the Pioneers of the Gayville and Meckling, South Dakota area

#### T. H. Wadsworth

Thomas Wadsworth born in 1852, came as a young man, from Oswego, New York to Council Bluffs, Iowa, returned to New York to be married to Fanny Atwood, returned to Council bluffs in 1881 and then to Yankton County in 1884 to operate a stock farm owned by a cousin of his, James R. Rice: he later bought the place where he is now living and spent the remainder of his life at the same place . The house into which he and his wife moved was made of logs. Mrs. Wadsworth helped organize the first ladies aid and the first Sunday School in the community. Mr. Wadsworth later built a large farm house to accommodate his family of seven children. After his sons took over the farm, he built a new modern home in Gayville right next to the farm. This house now belongs to his daughter, Mrs. William Klatt. Mrs. Klatt is an invalid and makes her home in a rest home in Yankton. None of the Wadsworths remain in the community.
