ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Roof covered with steel roofing over cedar shingles. May have a different foundation to replace a native rock foundation or concrete was poured outside of original foundation for extra support. Some of the horse stalls have been removed. 16' x 32' lean-to added on the East side later with a poured concrete foundation.

INTERIOR NOTES: Two rows of 6x6 posts with (3) 2x6's for beams to support 2x8 joists for hayloft floor. Enough evidence of the four double horse stalls establishes their location. 6'x10' granary still in the SW corner and an 8' x 10' granary still in the NW corner. Four milk cow stanchions still on place in the NE corner. 8' x 10' tall granary in the NW corner of hayloft.

OTHER NOTES: 2x6 stud walls with 1x10 shiplap sheathing and $\frac{1}{2}$ x6" cedar lap siding. 2x6 rafters with (2) 1x6's for brassing at reaching A 2x6 brass from top of wall in bayleft down to floor 6' O. C. All of the

(2) 1x6 S for bracing at root hip. A 2x6 brace from top of wait in hayfold down to hoor, 6 O. C. All of the
2x6 studs, rafters, beams & bracing, 2x8 floor joists, 6x6 posts and roof sheathing is rough sawn
cottonwood. 2x6 studs, rafters and bracing in East lean-to are all milled lumber. Windows were 9" x12"
four light. Cupola was removed when steel was installed on roof.




