ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Any evidence of horse stalls removed. Been remodeled many times. Has three store's renting now. 13' x 125' addition added on South and 25' x 21'-8" addition on the NW corner. Roof is covered with roll asphalt over cedar shingles and coated with white roof coating. Front (East) wall has been remodeled many times, can't determine what the front looked like.

INTERIOR NOTES: <u>Has seven rows of posts and 6x6 beams supporting the roof.</u> Two outside rows and center row have 6x6 posts. Four rows have 4x6 posts. Rafters are 2x6's. Five ply 2x12's for a beam 16' O.C. to support 2x8 joists for the flat roof. These floor joists run East to West.

OTHER NOTES: Masonry walls are clay tile and brick 14" thick. Gable end walls are 2x6 with sheathing


and rolled brick siding. 2x8 floor joists in the East 44' and 2x12 floor joists in the West 76'. East hayloft floor is raised 12" higher than West side. 10"x12" four light over 10"x12" four light windows.

Has an arched brick doorway on West side. Hayloft floor is 2" lumber and the  $\frac{3}{4}$ " sheathing, 2x6's, 2x8's, 2x12's, 4x6's and 6x6's are all rough sawn cottonwood.













SKETCH MAP










CAMERA DIRECTION: \_and 5ply 2x12 beam.

Hayloft, looking NE, 4x6 posts, bracing, 6x6 beam and 5ply 2x12 beam.





# HISTORY

The Waldorf Livery on 26 - 28 Center Street was constructed in 1902 or 1903. Both dates are listed but on different publications. It was built in anticipation of the increase of business due to the opening of the Waldorf Hotel. The Waldorf Livery has certainly survived the test of time.

Picture #10 in this survey shows the Waldorf Livery in the early 1900's as the new meets the old. Horse drawn carriages and Model T's lined up in front of the livery.

There were five other liveries in Vermillion at this time. They were Star Livery Feed and Stable, Collins and Harris Blacksmith Shop, Quinn's Dray Line, Callagher's Livery and Feed Barn, and the Wittecar Livery and Stables.

After the loss of livery business the Waldorf Livery served as automobile storage, an automobile dealership and showplace, (Benson Auto is still visible on the West side of building). In the 1950's most of the car dealerships moved out on Cherry Street and then numerous other businesses, including the Police Station, municipal liquor store, a bowling alley, Plain Talk (local newspaper), a bike shop, Dakota Decoys (a decoy store) were located here. Currently there is a bike shop, Dakota Decoys and A slightly used merchandise store.
