


Summary of the Clay County Barn Project from May 2011 – February 2014

Clay County Historical Preservation Commission Vermillion, South Dakota

I am a member of the Clay County Historical Preservation Commission in Vermillion, South Dakota. I joined the CCHPC in the spring of 2011. In June of 2011 the South Dakota State Historical Society contacted the CCHPC looking for a person or group to survey the old barns in their respective counties to preserve a record and history of old barns. The old barns are disappearing at a rapid pace. Barns have played a great role in the development of agriculture in Clay County, South Dakota, in the state of South Dakota and in this Great Nation. I volunteered right away, as I have been interested in barns since I was in grade school. The following is a summarization of this project from June 2011 up to February 2014.

The Challenge

This project has been a learning experience. The toughest part has been getting the message across to land owners who have a barn still standing on their farm. Too many farmers are afraid that this is a scheme by the government to raise the valuation of their buildings to collect more real estate taxes. I had to convince them that this is a volunteer project just preserve the history of barns and I am not a paid government agent.

I have done a lot of research to classification of barns, including analyzing barn construction methods and materials used to build barns. Over time how both construction methods and materials changed.

I was asked to put together a program to start educating the public for our Preservation Wednesday presentation in 2012. I put together a Power Point presentation, with the guidance from Evelyn Schlenker, as I had never worked using this method. The first presentation was on February 15, 2012 at the Vermillion Public Library. It was very well attended by area farmers, a group that now has a new understanding of the purpose and importance of this project.

From that presentation Dick and Louise Gregoire held a gathering at their home and introduced me to Gordon Jensen and Erlin Ellison. This was the start of the barn surveys in the Pleasant Valley Township area. These people helped spread the message. Since then Darlene Henrikson and Arden Abild have been added to the list of people that have been very helpful.

On May 16, 2012, I had the opportunity to do a second presentation at Wakonda. I included more barns in the northern and north central regions of Clay County. This was very successful, with a large crowd and many leads to barns in this area. As I surveyed barns in that area the people were so great in giving me additional leads. What great and helpful people, I can't thank them enough.

I gave another presentation on June 2, 2012 at the W. H. Over Museum. From this presentation, I was approached by Marion Kryger, asking if he could help line up barns in Norway Township. He said that he knew of a few. Marion, was born, raised and farmed in Norway Township until he retired and moved to Vermillion. Marion, who died recently, was a history buff and had recorded all of the rural schools in Clay County. He also researched names of teachers, students, 8th grade graduates and old pictures. All of this information is at the W. H. Over Museum, here in Vermillion.

Marion had set up appointments for me to survey almost all of the barns in Norway Township, with the exception of about six, which did get done later. He also did the same in southern Meckling Township. I couldn't thank Marion enough, he knew of barns that I would never have found. They were on vacated farmsteads in the timber along the Missouri River.

While Marion Kryger was lining up barns in the southwestern part of Clay County for the first part of the week, I was working the northeastern part of Clay County for the last part of the week. Some weeks we surveyed up to ten barns per week. I surveyed a barn for Craig Nelson who lived in Garfield Township. He introduced me to some of the Jensen's. I now believe that over half of Garfield Township is owned or rented by Jensen's. They were very helpful in spreading the word about this project and introduced me to other families with barns in that area. This extended up into Glenwood Township. I can't thank the people in the northeastern part of Clay County enough. What great people!

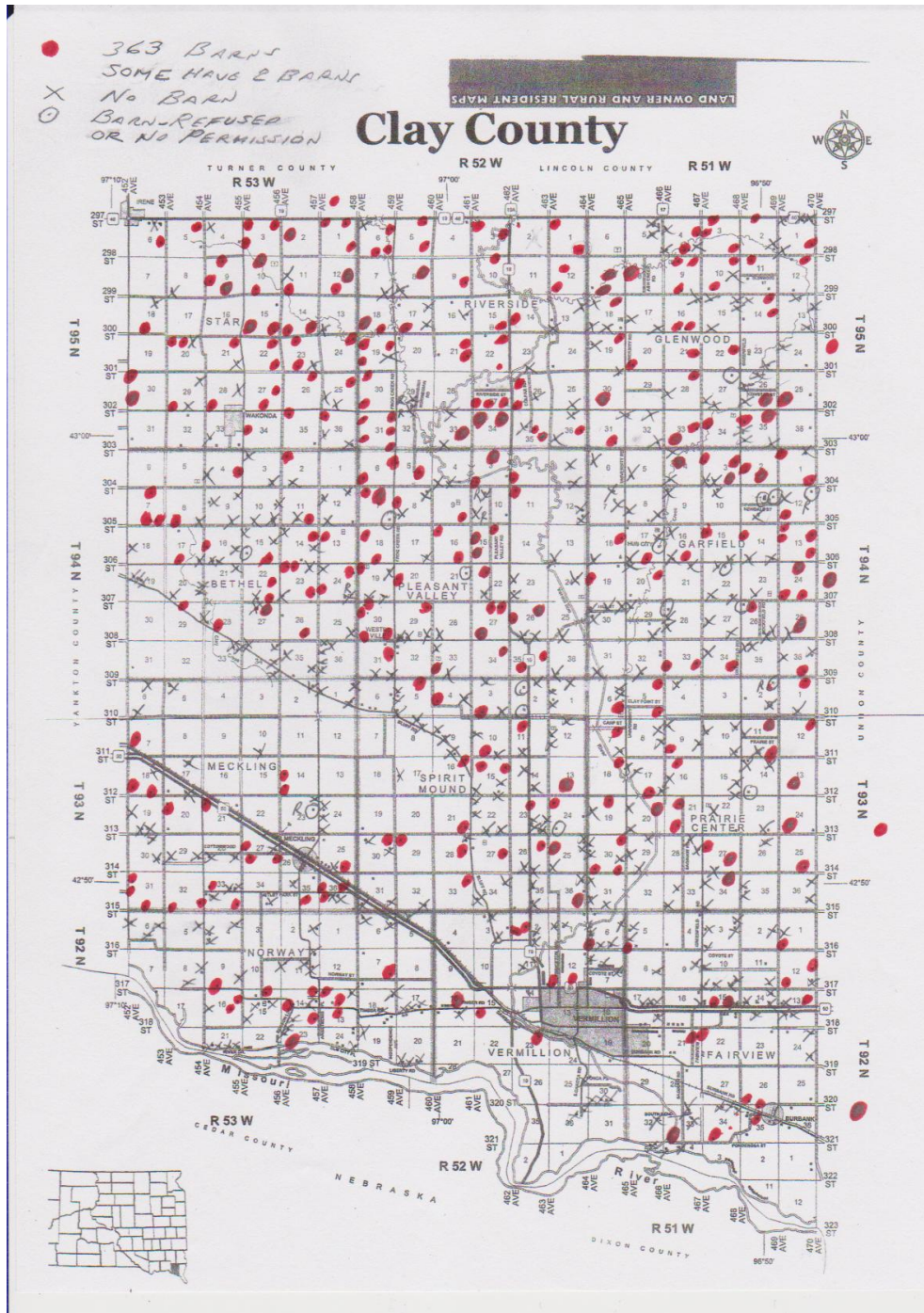
Since then I have given three presentations in Yankton, South Dakota, three in St. James, Nebraska, one at the Clay County Historical Society in Vermillion, three at Edith Siegrist Public Library in Vermillion, one at Clay County Court House, (during the Court House Centennial celebration) in Vermillion and one more at the W. H. Over Museum in Vermillion.

Sharing Historical Information With the General Public

In the digital age of today, I see historical information reaching most of the general public through web sites. Thus this electronic project includes all information, drawings and pictures on surveys of each barn. Some think that it is too detailed, but to fully understand the construction of barns that is also very important. Pictures are worth a thousand words and we really need them to fully share this information. The histories, associated with barns that I have gathered, too few I am afraid, also need to be shared to fully appreciate the determination the pioneers had for a better life. These histories are the building blocks of this great state of South Dakota and are now accessible to all.

The Clay County Historical Preservation Commission could not fit all of the information on our old web site. It was too archaic, so as a group it was decided that we build a new web site. This is no easy task. We finally went to a professional company who was very helpful. Now we have a web site with all of our publications. Pictures are in color, all drawings are included and it is a great improvement over what we had. More publications are to be added as they become available.

Types of Barns Found in Clay County

There is a variety of barn types that were found in Clay County. This section describes specific characteristics of each type that was surveyed.



Heavy post and beam barn

The post and beam barns are not common in Clay County. I have found a few. This barn shown above, was built in 1894. The whole barn is supported on tall posts, with horizontal beams mortised and tendon, supporting the hayloft floor and beams at the top, mortised and tendon, supporting the roof. These barns will have a gable roof and the siding will be 1x12 vertical boards with battens to cover the crack between the 1x12 boards. This particular barn used 6x6, 6x8, 8x8 posts and 6x6, 6x8, 8x8 and 10x10 beams.

Gable roof bank barn

Usually the framed wall of the barn basement faced south. The framed wall allowed for doors for access and windows for light and ventilation. The three rock walls were constructed from native stone and mortared with sand and lime. These barns can be three levels high. I did find two gambrel roof bank barns with three 8' poured concrete walls. This would have been a blending of the new roof style with the older basement style when Portland cement became available.



Gable roof barns

These barns have a simple roof with one slope on each side and the ridge in the middle of the long axis of the barn. Many have a lean-to on one or more sides. This type of barn usually has two levels, but some may have only one level. There are barns constructed from 1870 to the 1940's and would have been less expensive and probably was what the family could afford. This type of barn with one or more lean-to's can be classified as a western feeder barn. Most of the heavy post and beam barns and bank barns are also gable roof barns.



Gambrel roof barn

This type of barn seems to be the preferred style and is the public's image of a barn in the Midwest. Most were built between 1900 to the 1940's. The two-slope roof with a hip gives the barn this classification. The gambrel is also the middle joint of the bend in a horse's back legs, called the gambrel or gambrel joint. The roof shape allows for a higher roof and more volume to store loose hay. There are many ways to brace the hip for strength. Some use a post and beam and others use numerous different bracing methods.



Western feeder barn

This type of barn usually has the center half for hay storage from the ground level to the peak. However, the center area can have a hayloft that is raised about 8' to allow for livestock under the hayloft in the center of the barn. The space on each side was used for livestock. There are tall 2x6, 2x8, 4x6 or 6x6 walls on each side of the center barn area, up to 28' tall to support the center of the rafters, as this type of barn is usually wider. Some barns also have a hayloft over the side space or lean-tos. This type of barn was used for cattle feeders in Clay County. This type of barn is also more often found in ranching country farther west.



Round gothic roof barn also know as Wisconsin dairy barn

This type of barn has a round roof with a slight peak. This gives the roof a Gothic arch look and helps to shed the rain, rather than having an almost flat top on the peak of the roof. These barns were used for dairy cows, but also may have housed the draft horses. Some of the dairies were large dairies for their time, with more windows on the first floor. In Clay County these barns were built between 1920 through the 1930's in Clay County. However, there was one small barn built in 1965.

Materials and Construction Methods on Barns in Clay County

Materials do vary for barn construction in Clay County. Some of the very early barns used logs for posts and beams, some are squared with an adz. 6x6 posts became more common with 6x6 beams to support the hayloft floor. I have seen double spaced 2x6's, 4x6, 6x6, 6x8 and 8x8 posts. Beams are also varied, from two laminated 2x6's on small barns to three 2x8's, three 2x10's, three 2x12's, 4x4, 4x6, 6x6, 6x8's and one with 10"x10" beams. Floor joists are 2x8's most of the time, with 2x10's on some barns. I have seen 2x12's on two barns and 2x4's and 2x6's on some of the smaller barns. The joists are usually 24" O.C., but some are 12" O.C. under grain bins in the hayloft.

Most barns use 2x6's for stud walls. However, I have surveyed some 2x4 stud walls. I have also surveyed a few barns with 2x8 stud wall on the gable ends and some of those used 2x10 studs 14' to 16' wide in the center to re-enforce the large door openings. Most of the heavier stud walls have a plate at 14' to 20' and use 2x6 or 2x8 studs above to the roof line. The height of walls varies from 7'-6" tall to 16' not counting the gable end walls.

Just over one half of the barns have sheathing on the sidewalls, which can be rough boards, milled boards or 1x8 to 1x10 shiplap or original vertical siding or 3/4" drop or car siding. About 17 % of the barns have the sheathing diagonal, which gives the wall tremendous strength. The diagonal sheathing is sometimes just on the gable ends, but a few more have diagonal sheathing on all four walls. I observe the barns with diagonal sheathing are usually straighter and very plumb compared to the horizontal sheathing. Most these barns have 1/2"x6" cedar lap siding, but a few have 1x6 pattern #106 drop siding. Just under one half of the barns have no sheathing and just 1x6 or 1x8 pattern #106 drop siding and some 1x6 car siding. I observe the no sheathing and 3/4" siding, more in the northern part of the Clay County.

Rafters are usually 2x6's. About 40% of the barns are gambrel roof. The rafter construction is very fascinating. It seems that every barn has a little different bracing system. I keep hoping to find a Shawver truss system. I surveyed one that was close and a few with one half of a Shawver truss. I finally found one Shawver truss system in barn #216 in Section 4, Glenwood Township. Most of the gambrel rafters would have to be classified as a braced rafter system, but they are so varied in the bracing methods. Some use a post and beam system to support the hip. The posts can be double 2x4's, double 2x6's, 4x6's or 6x6's or 6x8's to support the hip. There can be a 2x6 plate or two 2x6's, or a 4x6 or 6x6 for a beam at the hip. I have seen a few with a double 2x6, a 4x6 or a 6x6 rafter behind the 6x6 posts with two 2x10's from the bottom of the rafter down to the bottom of the 6x6 post and tied to the floor joists. There is usually a diagonal brace to help support the hip and bracing from the top of the wall in the hayloft down to the floor joists.

Round Gothic rafter barns are often referred as Wisconsin dairy barns. I have surveyed a few of these. The construction of the round rafters, are also so varied. Some barns used

5 plies of 1x12's about 8' long. These were hand nailed and the arc was sawn by hand in 1920's. I surveyed one made of full 1" x full 2" rough sawn cottonwood. It was 6 plies thick and built on site. I surveyed another with 3/4"x 1-1/2" Western Red Cedar five plies thick. That barn also had special rafters 7 plies thick as bracing for the gable end walls. These attached to the second rafter, curved down to the center of wall in the hayloft and down and fastened to the beams that supported the hayloft floor. Some of the round gothic rafters are manufactured and delivered to the site.

Gable roof rafters are usually 2x6's and also varied in bracing methods. Some use posts of 4x6's or 6x6's to support the center of the rafter. I have seen two 2x6's, single 2x6 and 2x4's for posts. These posts support a beam of double 2x4's or double 2x6's or a single 2x8, 4x4, 4x6 or a 6x6 to support the center of the rafters. Some have bracing from the top of the wall in the hayloft down to the floor joists.

Western feeder barns have a 2x6, double 2x6, 4x6 or 6x6 walls 16' to 28' high to support the center of the rafters. They have diagonal bracing from the rafters down to the wall. I see more diagonal bracing on the walls of this type of a barn. This type of barn can be very wide, up to 56'.

Barns built before 1890 commonly had native rock with no mortar or with sand and lime mortar. This also seemed to be the period of bank barns that were built into a side hill with a basement. After that time period, Portland cement became available and most foundations were poured concrete and bank barn construction seemed to have stopped. I did survey two bank barns with 8' poured concrete walls and a gambrel roof. I would really like the date of construction on these two barns. They both are on vacated farms.

I see a lot of rough sawn cottonwood 2x4's, 2x6's 2x8's, 2x10's, 2x12's, 4x4's, 4x6's, 6x6's and 6x8's used in barns in southern Clay County. This is because the Missouri River bottom contained large cottonwood trees and there were several local saw mills operating in the area up into the 1940's. As I surveyed farther north there was less rough sawn cottonwood. Most of the lumber is milled lumber, which would have been shipped in by the railroad. However I did find some rough sawn cottonwood in northern Clay County. Those barns appear to be built in late 1800's.

With the exception of the Anderson Farm barn, the Danish brick barn and the Messler Swedish barn, which are all on the National Register, I have not seen any ties to a specific ethnic group. I have also seen several barns with milk cow stalls (not stanchions) in northeastern Clay County, but I can't tie that to a specific group. They are Swedish, Norwegian and Danish families that built or had these barns built. I would describe most barns that I have surveyed as vernacular types of architecture. Some of the very early barns are the heavy posts and beams, but I can't tie that to a specific group, other than northern European.

Two Examples of Barn Survey Reports

The next section gives examples of the type of information gathered during the surveying of a barn. This includes the location of the barn, when it was surveyed and the specific characteristics of each barn. Photographs show the status of the barn when it was surveyed. Drawings of a cross section and a floor plan were done to help people visualize the construction. A map of the township at the end of a survey denotes the location of the barn that is circled. Research of the original homesteaders map in 1884, and the Clay County Atlases from 1894, 1901, 1912, 1924, 1937, 1948 and 1956 show the owners of the sites. This was a great help to determine the owners of the farm when the barn was built. Any history that could be found is included at the end of the survey.

The first survey report is on the Black Horse Johnson barn, Section 25, Garfield Twp., Clay County.

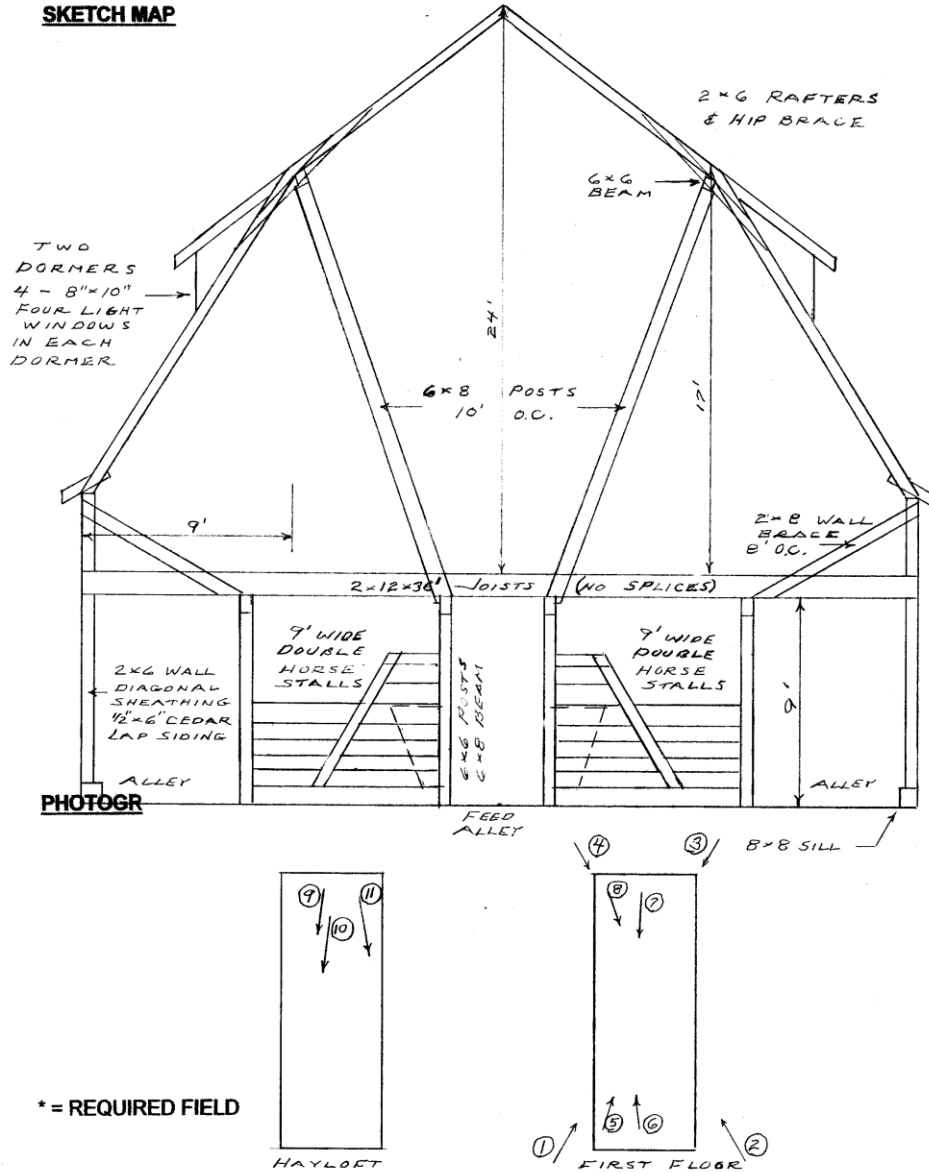
ALTERED/MOVED NOTES: Original site. Steel roofing on the roof. 8"x10" four light windows over 8"x10" four light windows have been replaced with 8"x10" vinyl windows. The swinging doors have all been replaced with new doors built like the original's. Two cupola's have been removed when the steel roofing was installed on the roof.

INTERIOR NOTES: Four rows of 6x6 posts and 6x8 beams to support hayloft floor. Floor joists for the hayloft floor are 2x12 x 36' long, no splices. Eight 9' wide double horse stalls at the South end and twelve 7' double horse stalls in the North end. Stalls for 40 workhorses. 8" x 8" sills on the foundation.

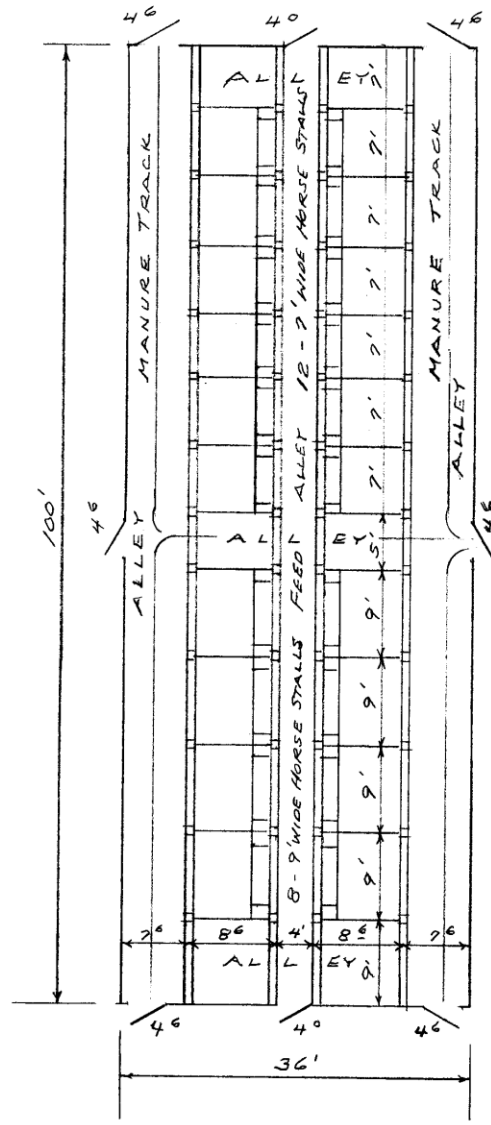
OTHER NOTES: Walls are 2x6 x 12' high with diagonal sheathing and 1/2" x 6" cedar lap siding. Three (3) sliding doors in the hayloft floor over the center feed alley to drop hay to horses. Manure track on each of the East and West alleys, which the West side curved into the center alley and the East side curved going out the East door. The curved parts of the track can be moved to accommodate the North or the South manure tracks. There are double swinging hooks to hang harness on the East and West walls. The hooks can swing back against the wall when not in use to protect the horses entering or leaving the stalls.

***PHYSICAL NOTES:** Barn is in excellent condition. The horse stalls are all still in place. They are still in excellent condition. Windows are 8"x10" four light windows over 8"x10" four light windows. They are double hung for ventilation. The day that I surveyed this barn it was very hot, in the high 90's. I opened three of the swing doors and had a very nice breeze through the barn. It was almost like it was air-conditioned. Two dormers in the hayloft on the West and East sides, with 4 8" x 10" four light windows.

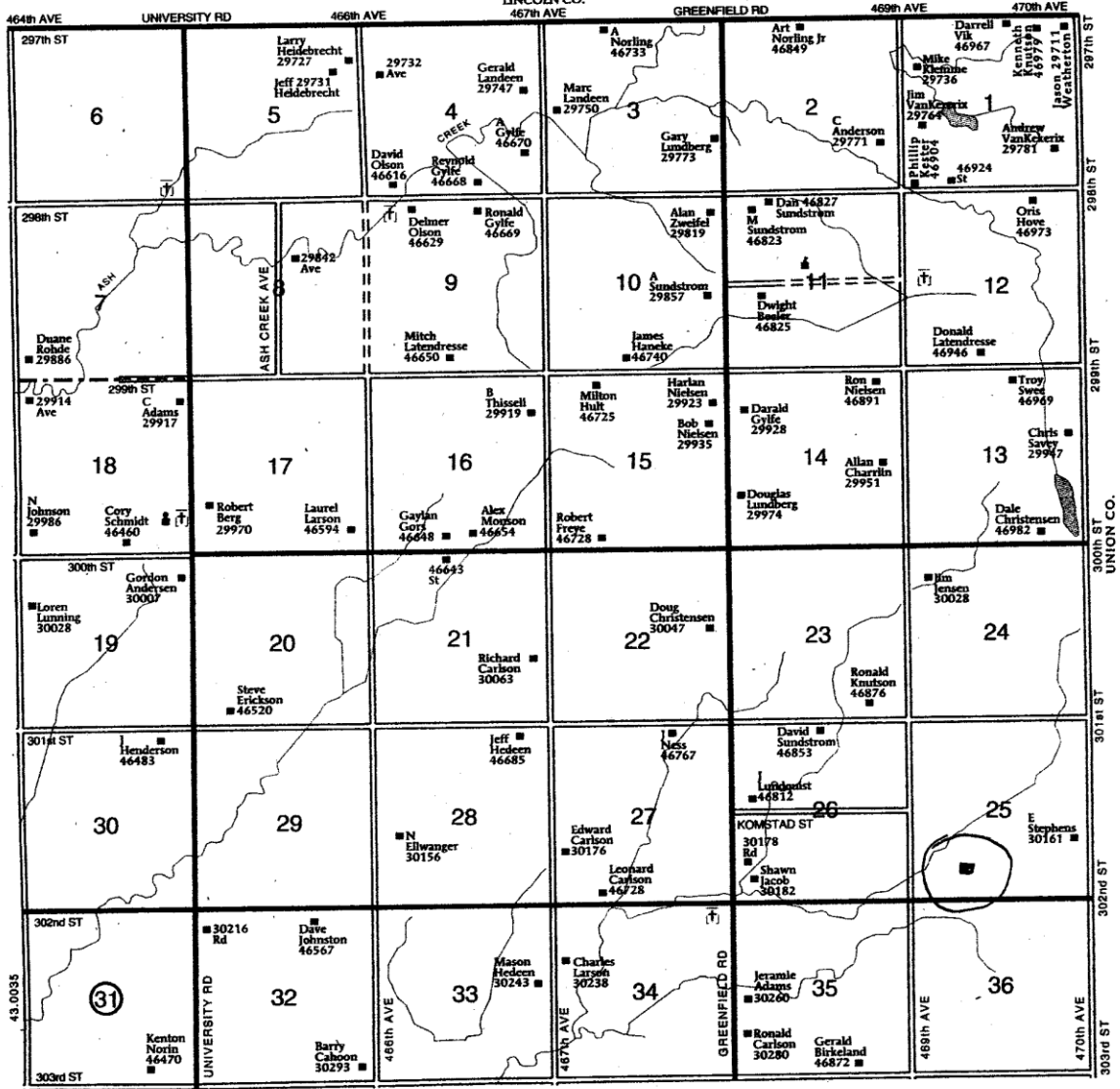

HISTORY

This farm located in the SW ¼ of Section 25, Glenwood Township, Clay County was homesteaded by Axel Odeen.

The 1894 Clay County Atlas lists Axel Odeen as the owner.

The 1901, 1912 and 1924 Clay County Atlases list Peter J. Johnson as the owner.

The 1937 and 1948 Clay County Atlases list Harry Johnson as the owner.

The 1956 Clay County Atlas lists Axel F. Johnson as the owner.

Black Horse Johnson Barn Narrative

C. F. Johnson settled in this area after it was homesteaded. He would have bought land patents from homesteaders. C. F. Johnson had four sons, Ernest T., Lee, Axel F. and Harry. They continued to buy land in this area. In the 1924 Clay Atlas they owned 400 acres in Section 25, 280 acres in Section 36 and 320 acres in Section 24. Harry Johnson is not listed as the owner of any of this land. However all three sections border the Union County, so they may have owned land in Union County also. The Oral history from more than one Clay County resident says that they farmed between 1000 to 2000 acres of land.

The four Johnson brothers lived on this farm. They never married. They lived an eccentric life style as per oral history from several people in Clay County. They did not believe in or trust banks.

The Johnson brothers raised black Percheron draft horses, black Angus cattle and black Poland china hogs. They bought several farms. If they farmed 1000 to 2000 acres of land, that would have been a massive farm operation with horses.

They bred, raised and trained the black Percheron horses and sold matching teams. They were known in a large area for the quality, the well trained and the matching of teams of their black Percheron horses.

This barn is said to have been a Sear's and Roebuck barn package that would have come in on the railroad. It would have been hauled from the depot in Beresford.

It is a very impressive barn with 2x12 x 36' floor joists for the hayloft floor, no splices just one piece. The 8x8 sills have square dovetails at each corner and square shiplap splicing at each joint. Three sliding doors in the hayloft floor over the 100' long center feed alley for dropping hay from the hayloft when feeding the horses. The doors could

be closed to keep heat in the barn during cold weather. The massive 6x8 posts with 6x6 beams to support the hip of the rafters. These posts come through the hayloft floor and are notched over a post and the 6x8 beam so they can't kick out at the bottom. There were two dormers on the hayloft on the West side and two dormers on the East side. There were four 8" x 10" four light windows in each dormer to provide light in the hayloft early in the morning and late at night as there would not have been electric lights at that time. Lanterns would have too great of a fire hazard with all of the very dry hay in the hayloft.

The manure track with its switch-able curved section of track is a design that I have never seen before. In the West alley it could move to allow a manure bucket from the South to turn into the center feed alley and out the East door or the same from the North. The East manure track worked the same, and curved to go out the East door.

The horse barn would have held 40 head of horses or 20 teams. I can't imagine cleaning all of these stalls every day. They did have a very good manure track system to make that job a lot easier. Imagine harnessing all of these horses every morning. Think of how long it must have taken to feed, water and curry down this many horses.

I also don't know the dates that they may have lived and farmed here in Clay County. I have found that C. F. Johnson owned land and some of the sons owned land in a 1912 Clay County atlas. In the 1924 atlas the sons owned even more land.

The following is some of the oral history that I have heard from more than one Clay County residents.

The Johnson brothers would never all leave the farm at the same time. One always stayed at home when they needed to go to town or conduct any business away from the farm.

They bought an adjacent farm and had to go to a bank to settle with the seller. They brought cream cans to the bank. The banker counted all of the silver dollars in these cream cans. They were short a small amount. One brother says to the other "I told you that we should have brought that other cream can."

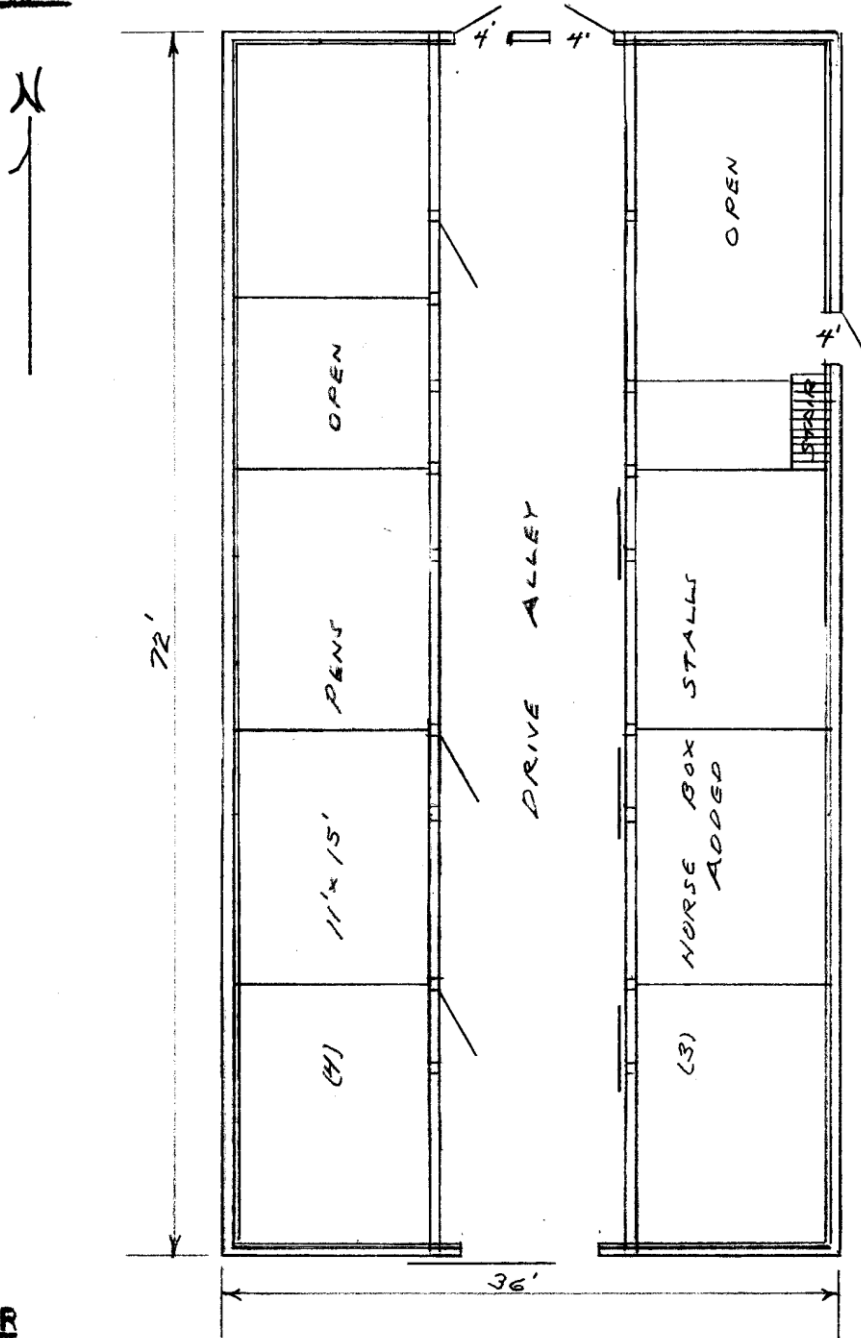

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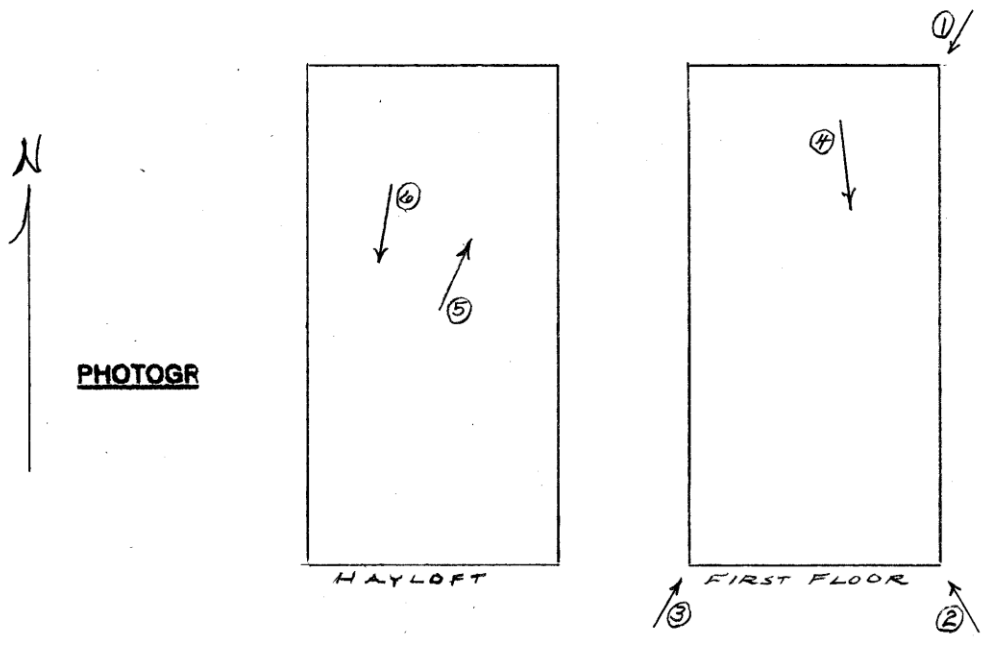
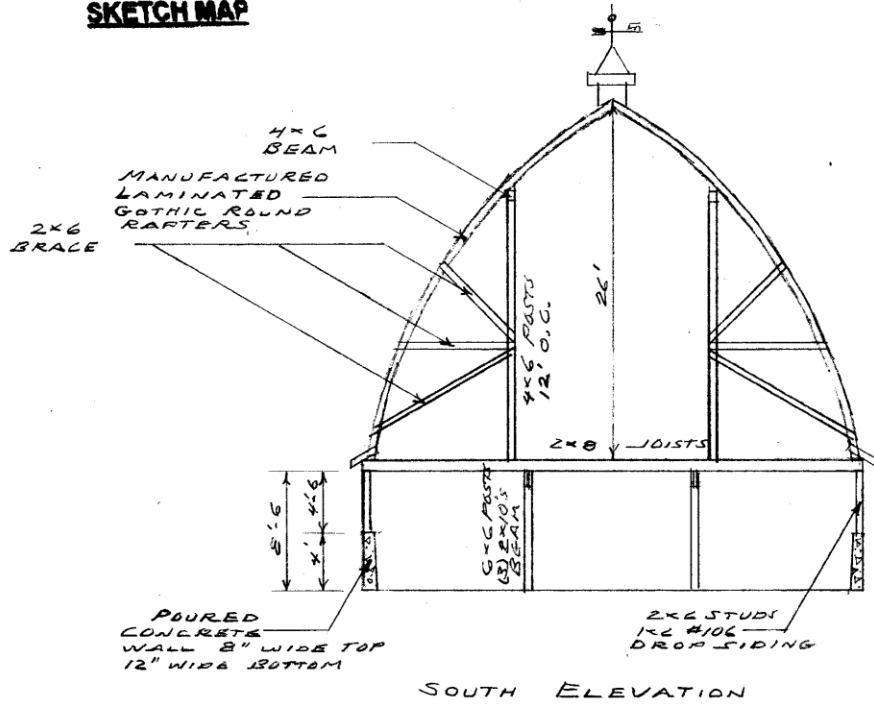
SKETCH MAP

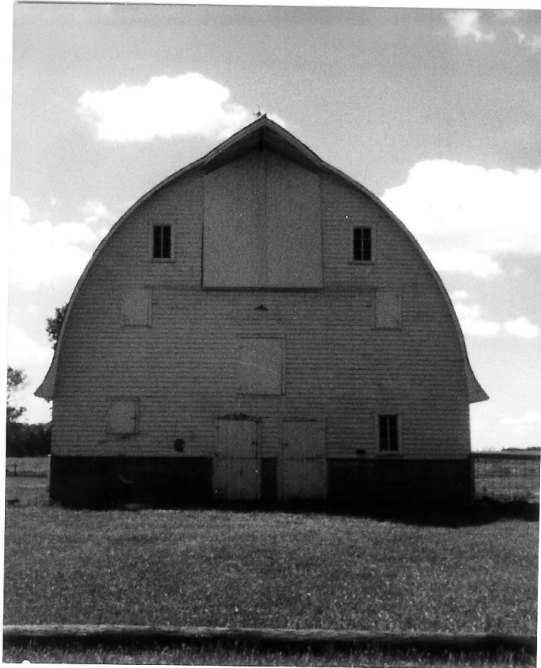

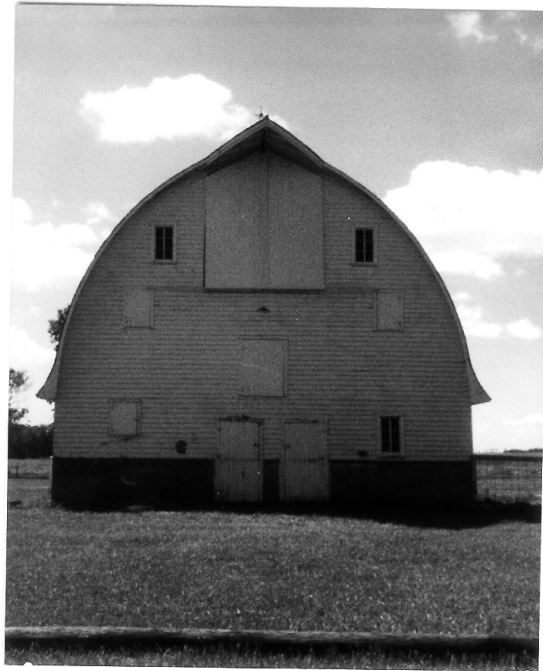

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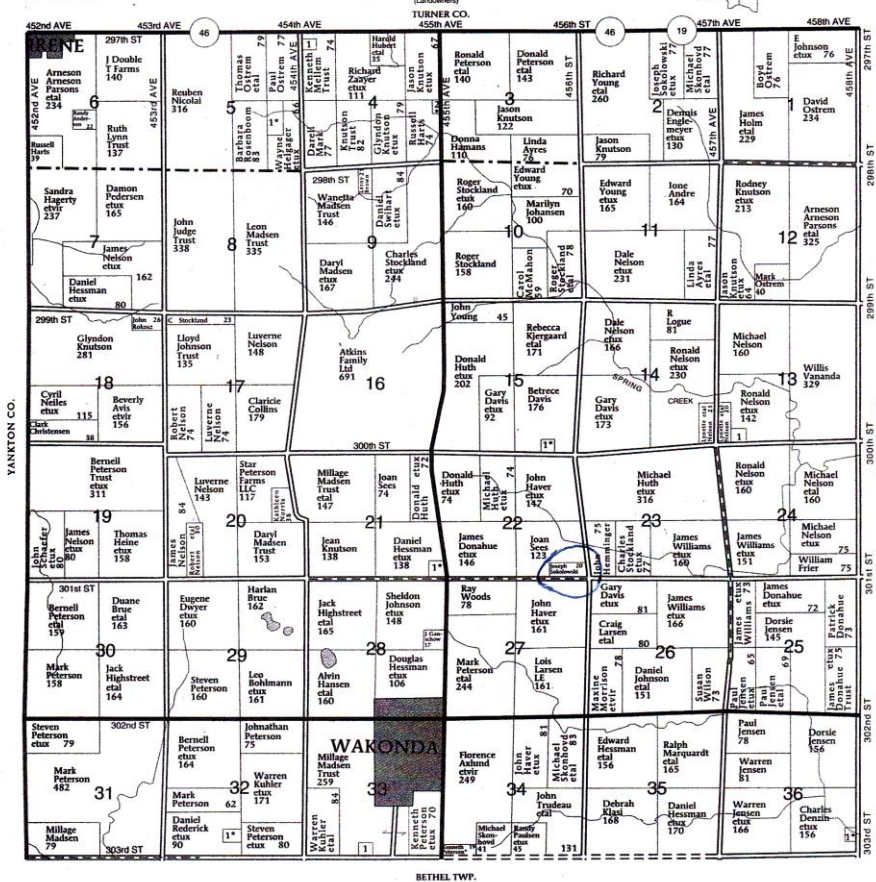

Histories

I have found a great number of histories from the homesteader's early years. Some of these stories are so fascinating, others with so many hardships and some showing the determination of the early pioneers to live a better life on their own land, which was not possible in their native country.

Just a couple of interesting histories-

August and Johanna Soderstrom

August Soderstrom (1848 –1930) came to America in 1869 from Sweden. He stopped at Pittsburgh, Pa. and worked in the steel mills to earn money to travel west. From there he went to Council Bluffs, Iowa to lay railroad tracks and left for Dakota Territory in 1872 to homestead in Glenwood Township, Clay County. His betrothed, Johanna Sundstrom (1859- 1935) of Lulea, Sweden, came to Sioux City, Iowa and was married to August. August and his bride came to the homestead where they lived for over 50 years. The homestead is now owned by Art Norling Jr.

When fall came, the Soderstroms had their dugout ready, but only had a few dollars to buy food for the winter. August was hired by the U. S. Post Office to deliver mail to Lennox once a week. The mail was brought from Vermillion, to Stephen's store by another horseback rider. August rode his horse across the prairie country, only trails and no bridges to cross the Vermillion River and the many creeks. For this two-day trip, he was paid \$10. Johanna was often called by the neighbors to be a midwife and help nurse the sick.

A few years after they arrived, the Soderstroms built a small frame house. It burned to the ground one cold winter day. One of the older daughters helped carry water to try to stop the blaze and another daughter had to take the smaller children to a straw filled manger in the barn to keep them warm until they could take the family by horseback or by foot to their grandparent's home.

Sylvester and Sarah Fargo

Sylvester Fargo and Sarah Congdon were married in New York on April 11, 1855. Four of their children were born there: Charles 1857; Mary, 1858; Frank, 1860; and Ella, 1862. The Fargo's joined the James S. Foster Colony of one hundred families and started for Dakota Territory in April, 1864. They traveled as far as Marshalltown by train. From

there, they came by ox team and covered wagon, arriving in Dakota in June. Joel Fargo was born October 1, 1864 in Yankton. Sylvester served in the first territorial legislature. In 1868 Sylvester took a homestead claim in Clay County. Their sixth child, James S. Fargo was born in 1868 in a log cabin. In 1871, Carrie was born, but died as an infant. The old stage road went past the homestead and many Indians stopped and enjoyed Sarah's johnny cakes and sorghum molasses. Many times the braves rolled in their blankets and slept "thick as flies" on the floor while the family slept in the loft.

The Fargo's hired some of the hardworking sons of Danish and Norwegian immigrants to help with the farming under the supervision of Sarah. Sylvester started freighting to Deadwood in 1878 with 16 yoke of oxen hitched to three wagons to supply the needs of gold miners. After Sylvester left with his first wagon-loads in early spring, Sarah would put up butter in one hundred-pound firkins in brine and canned garden produce and had it loaded on a boat at Yankton to be shipped to Pierre. Sylvester, after delivering his first load would return to Pierre and pick up the second load that had been unloaded from the steamship and warehoused. This way he could get two trips Deadwood before winter set in. He would quit freighting when the railroad reached the Black Hills. The Fargo's built their farm home in 1880. They brought cottonwood saplings from the banks of the Missouri and planted around the farmstead. Sarah took great pride in winning prizes at county and state fairs on fancy work, baking and gardening. She even won prizes at the Worlds Fair in Chicago in 1893. Sylvester died in 1900 and Sarah in 1916. They were buried in the Yankton Cemetery.

James S. Fargo, the only child of Sylvester Fargo's to remain in the community. Jim and Louise Mahacek were married in 1891 by Reverend Y. R. Oaks of the Methodist Church at Gayville. Dolly had come to Dakota from St. Louis, Mo. as a woman. She and her husband were active members of the Gayville Methodist Church for over half a century. Their children were; Albert, Etta (Mrs. Jess Spry), Edith (Mrs. Melvin Mortensen), Ruth 1908-1971 (Mrs. Evar John), Charles and Stanley.

They were all reared and educated in this community. Jim was a long time merchant of Gayville, as the proprietor of the Farmer's Store. Two of the Fargo son's Charles and Stanley are still residents of this community. Charles married Edna Schaeffer and they have two sons, James and Bill. Mark farmed in this community until he retired several years ago. He married Lucille Hazen and they had six children; Beulah (Mrs. Don Anderson); Mary (Mrs. Nels Jensen); Eunice (Mrs. Russell Hanson); Lois R. (Mrs. Alec Solberg); Judith (Mrs. Tom Ingalls) and John M. Fargo.
